## 4 Compulsory Acquisition

### Question 2.4.1

**At Annex A is a document headed “A14 Cambridge to Huntingdon improvement scheme: list of all objections to the granting of compulsory acquisition powers”. The document records the ExA’s understanding of the objections which have been received to the applicant’s request for the grant of compulsory acquisition and temporary use powers.**

**The applicant is asked to please check the contents of Annex A and confirm whether or not they agree with its contents and, if not, to identify by way of track changes any amendments, additions or deletions with explanations where necessary.**

### Response

1. As requested Highways England has reviewed the document provided at Annex A and any amendments, additions or deletions, with explanations as required have been provided, by way of tracked changes.
2. These changes have been made on the basis of identifying those persons listed within Part 1 of the *Book of Reference* (Applicant reference 3.1, PINS reference APP-007) (i.e. those whose land interests are subject to proposed compulsory acquisition by Highways England) who have submitted objections to the scheme within the Examination process.
3. Highways England notes that Annex A also includes parties who have submitted representations to the scheme who have not been identified in the *Book of Reference*. Given that these parties have not been identified in the *Book of Reference*, Highways England has not reviewed these entries in detail, although in order to seek to assist the Examining Authority, the existing work on analysis of the relevant representations has been used to amend the topics raised.
4. Subject to these points, Highways England confirms that it is in agreement with the amended version of the document provided at Appendix 6.1 and that it is an accurate record of the objections to the granting of compulsory acquisition and temporary use powers.

## Question 2.4.2

**Land plans 28 (plot 28/7) and 29 (plots 29/4,29/7) show Land to be acquired for landscaping. The scale of the Land Plans make it difficult to ascertain the extent of the land taken.**

**Both Napp Pharmaceuticals and Bard Pharmaceuticals are concerned that the proposed land take interferes with fibre optic cables laid in the ground, appears unacceptably close to the corner of one of their buildings and could remove up to 90 car parking spaces adjacent to their building Unit 196.**

**The ExA accompanied site visit could not clarify the matter.**

**Could the applicant look at the detailed design proposals for this area if necessary in collaboration with the parties concerned and advise the ExA whether the fears of the parties are warranted and the land take will have the effects outlined above or otherwise.**

## Response

5. Highways England has had on-going discussions with both Napp Pharmaceuticals and Bard Pharmaceuticals. Highways England has confirmed, which has been documented in the *Statement of Common Ground* (PINS reference REP3-002) (submitted to the Planning Inspectorate at Deadline 3, on 26 June 2015, by Napp Pharmaceuticals Ltd, Bard Pharmaceuticals Ltd and Mundipharma Research Ltd), that plots 28/17, 29/4 & 29/7 will not be required permanently but that Highways England would need temporary access to these areas to install the footings for a gantry. Since Deadline 3, an updated Statement of Common Ground has been developed, which has been submitted for Deadline 7 (Applicant reference HE/A14/EX/98).
6. Details of the length of temporary access required, exact location of the gantry and screening planting to be provided will be confirmed and agreed, in discussion with all interested parties, as part of the detailed design process. There will be no permanent loss of car parking at this site and Highways England will ensure that the construction process and subsequent planting, which would be provided as accommodation works, does not interfere with the fibre optic cable at this site or any of the buildings. Highway England's work would be scheduled and agreed with the interested parties to ensure it causes the least amount of temporary disruption to their on-going work at this site.

7. Whilst no change to the *Land Plans* or *Book of Reference* is proposed, Highways England intends to enter into an agreement with Napp Pharmaceuticals and Bard Pharmaceuticals. This agreement would include an undertaking given by Highways England not to exercise powers of compulsory acquisition in respect of the land in plots 28/17, 29/4 and 29/7, but to carry out works using powers of temporary possession pursuant to Article 31 of the draft Development Consent Order (an explanation of the powers in Article 31 is set out in paragraph 2 of Highways England's *Response to the ExA's First Written Questions: Report 4 Compulsory Acquisition* (Applicant reference HE/A14/EX/31, PINS reference REP2-006)).
8. This approach will enable Highways England to accommodate the concerns expressed by Napp Pharmaceuticals and Bard Pharmaceuticals in the Statement of Common Ground and on the Examining Authority's accompanied site visit (on 17 July 2015) whilst avoiding the need for Highways England to request changes to the application documentation in respect of matters, the exact detail of which, still needs to be determined through the detailed design process.
9. In the context of Highways England's intended approach (explained above), the fears of Napp Pharmaceuticals and Bard Pharmaceuticals are unwarranted, as it is Highways England's intention to avoid causing the potential detrimental effects which have been highlighted by Napp Pharmaceuticals and Bard Pharmaceuticals.



### Question 2.4.3

**On our accompanied site visit to Cambridge crematorium on the 17th July 2015 the ExA noted that the proposed new entrance to the crematorium close to the north west corner is located between the Muslim burial area and an area of woodland or garden used for the scattering of ashes and the planting of trees.**

**It appeared to the ExA that the proposal would substantially interfere with the area where ashes are scattered and trees are planted.**

**Are there any legal impediments or requirements to be complied with relating to the removal of such an area and if there are, how does the applicant propose to deal with them.**

**Further, what consultation and discussion has taken place with the Crematorium authority, Cambridge City Council, on this matter and how the intended use of this land will be managed sensitively having regard to its current use**

### Response

10. The area of the Crematorium where ashes are scattered and trees are planted is identified by the Crematorium on its official site plan (available on its website: <https://www.cambridge.gov.uk/crematorium>, or directly via this link: <https://www.cambridge.gov.uk/sites/www.cambridge.gov.uk/files/documents/crematorium-site-map.pdf>) as Area 16, Wildflower Wood and Pond. A copy of this site plan is appended to this report at Appendix 6.2. This area is available for the informal scattering of ashes and is not consecrated ground. Cambridge City Council states (on its website) that "*none of the cemeteries [in its administrative area] have any consecrated areas*"; and explains that "*when cremated remains [i.e. ashes] are strewn, they are distributed over a wide area of ground. Chemical reactions resulting from exposure to the elements quickly break down the remains, already in granular form, so that within a few days little trace can be observed*". The fact that ashes do not retain a lasting presence on or in the land over which they are scattered is reflected in the absence of any legislative or regulatory provisions having the effect of designating land on which ashes are scattered as consecrated land or burial grounds.
11. Therefore, whilst there are legal restrictions on the use of consecrated land and burial grounds (the latter being land in which human remains (including ashes) are buried or interred), it is Highways England's view that the area in question will not be subject to the legal restrictions that apply to the compulsory acquisition, or to the use for other purposes, of consecrated land and burial grounds.

12. Highways England's intended use of this land, which is within plot 23/14b (shown on Sheet 23 of the *Land Plans* (Applicant reference 2.3; PINS reference APP-065), is for temporary use and possession to enable the construction of a new private means of access to the Crematorium, providing access off the new Dry Drayton to Girton Local Access Road. Once the access has been provided it will form part of the grounds of the Crematorium. As a consequence, the area in question (Area 16, Wildflower Wood and Pond, within the grounds of the Crematorium) would be reduced in size. It will not be possible to ascertain the exact dimensions of that reduction until detailed design is carried out. It is anticipated that part of Plot 23/14b will be used to provide the new access, whilst the remainder of it will be used to provide working space to facilitate the construction of the new access into the Crematorium.
  
13. Highways England has discussed these plans in detail with Cambridge City Council on a number of occasions and a further meeting is being arranged to continue these discussions. Cambridge City Council agree that the new access Highways England is intending to provide will be better than the existing access (direct from the A14). Highways England is very aware of the sensitive nature of this site and will therefore continue to work with Cambridge City Council to ensure any work at this location is undertaken in an appropriate manner and with sensitivity to the on-going use and operation of this site.

## Question 2.4.4

**We refer to the relevant representation made by the National Farmers Union dated 12th June 2015 on behalf of its members affected by the A14 proposals (RR-455).**

**Please provide a detailed response to the points raised in the submission.**

## Response

14. This response addresses the points raised in the relevant representation made by the National Farmers Union (the NFU) dated 12 June 2015 (relevant representation 476; PINS reference RR-455), which will be referred to as the NFU's outline representations in this response.
15. NFU's outline representations relate to the use of the powers of compulsory acquisition and temporary possession for the creation of borrow pits and the use of minerals extracted from them, the creation of floodplain compensation areas, landscaping areas and areas to be used to provide site compounds, storage and working space during construction ('construction areas') (see paragraph 10 of the NFU's outline representations); concerns about consultation with landowners; and issues with the extraction of minerals from borrow pits.
16. The NFU contends (at paragraph 11 of its outline representations) that the matters identified in paragraph 10 of its outline representations (see paragraph 15 above) are not matters for which powers of compulsory acquisition and/or powers of temporary possession of land can lawfully be included in the draft Development Consent Order (DCO) (at articles 20 (compulsory acquisition) and 30 (temporary possession)).
17. Highways England does not accept this contention, for the reasons set out in the following paragraphs.

## Compulsory acquisition

18. Section 122 of the Planning Act 2008 (which is the enabling power authorising the compulsory acquisition of land) provides that an order granting development consent (a DCO) may include provision authorising the compulsory acquisition of land if the Secretary of State (in deciding whether or not to make a DCO) is satisfied that "*the land is required for the development to which the development consent relates; [or] is required to facilitate or is incidental to that development*" (subsection 122(2)(a)-(b) of the Planning Act 2008).

19. Highways England's position is that the creation of borrow pits and the use of minerals from them; and the creation of floodplain compensation areas, landscaping areas and construction areas is required for, and is required to facilitate, the development of the A14 Cambridge to Huntingdon improvement scheme ('the scheme'), for which development consent is sought. The proposed creation and use of borrow pits, floodplain compensation areas, landscaping areas and construction areas are therefore matters which are within the scope of subsection 122(2) of the Planning Act 2008 and the conditions in that subsection in relation to which the Secretary of State must be satisfied. It therefore follows that they are matters for which powers of compulsory acquisition can lawfully be included in the draft DCO for the scheme.
20. The NFU argues (at paragraph 12 of its outline representations) that as the creation of borrow pits and the use of minerals from them, and the creation of floodplain compensation areas, landscaping areas and construction areas will occur during the construction period of the scheme, "*powers of permanent compulsory acquisition of land are not required as the affected land is not required permanently.*"
21. Highways England's position in relation to this argument is set out in its *Response to the ExA's First Written Questions: Report 4 Compulsory Acquisition* (Applicant reference HE/A14/EX/31, PINS REP2-005), specifically in response to question 1.4.1.
22. Further detailed reasoning, justifying Highways England's approach to the proposed use of powers of (permanent) compulsory acquisition, is set out in paragraphs 63.4.8 to 63.4.19 of Highways England's response to the NFU's Written Representation, located in Highways England's *Response to Written Representations, Report 5 - Land Interests* (Applicant reference HE/A14/EX/53, PINS reference REP4-015). This approach is proposed within the context of Highways England's position as set out in its response to first written question 1.4.1, in which the use of 'lesser powers', such as the taking of rights only, as suggested in paragraph 16 of the NFU's outline representations, is considered as a possibility, subject to the outcomes of the detailed design process.
23. The NFU states (at paragraph 13 of its outline representations) that "*it will represent that the Applicant has failed to show that the landscaping mitigation measures are required on the scale sought or at all, and has failed to show by hydrological evidence that the flood alleviation areas and balancing ponds as specified are required on the scale sought or at all.*"

24. With regard to flood alleviation/flood plain compensation measures, Highways England's position is set out in Table 2.1, under the key topic heading 'Water' at pages 4 to 8 of *Highways England's Response to the A14 Agents Association's Written Summary (submitted at Deadline 5, 22 July 2015) of Oral Submissions made by the A14 Agents Association, the National Farmers Union and Camilla Horsfall of Carter Jonas at the first Issue Specific Hearing on the Draft DCO (held on 15 July 2015)* (Applicant reference HE/A14/EX/74, PINS reference REP6-003) (*'Highways England's response to the A14 Agents Association and NFU'*).
25. In NFU's written summary of oral submissions made at the Issue Specific Hearing on the draft DCO, there is no mention of balancing ponds. However, Highways England's position is that the proposed balancing ponds are a necessary part of the drainage provision for the scheme. Detailed explanation regarding the need for the balancing ponds and floodplain compensation areas, together with justification for their location and size, is set out in *Highways England's Response to the ExA's First Written Questions: Report 13 Water Issues*, at question 1.13.10 (Applicant reference HE/A14/EX/40, PINS reference REP2-014) and at paragraphs 63.6.1 to 63.6.3, 63.6.10 to 63.6.14 and 63.6.17 of *Highways England's Response to Written Representations: Report 5 - Land Interests*, which responds to the NFU's Written Representation (PINS reference REP2-164).
26. With regard to landscaping mitigation measures, Highways England's position is set out in Table 2.1, under the key topic heading 'Landscape' at pages 12 to 13 of *Highways England's response to the Written Representation of A14 Agents Association and NFU*.
27. The NFU contends (at paragraph 14 of its outline representations) that if Highways England has failed to show that "*the landscaping mitigation measures, flood alleviation areas and balancing ponds as specified are required on the scale sought or at all*" then "*it follows that the affected land is neither required for the development to which the DCO will relate, nor is required to facilitate or is incidental to that development within the meaning of section 122(1) and (2)(a)-(b) of the Planning Act 2008*"; and, "*Further, there cannot be a 'compelling case in the public interest for the land to be acquired compulsorily', that is, permanently, within the meaning of section 122(3) of the 2008 Act where the land is only required temporarily, or where the taking of rights only would be sufficient.*"
28. In response, Highways England's position is:
- that it has demonstrated (through the reasoning set out in the documents referred to above) that the proposed landscaping mitigation measures, floodplain compensation areas and balancing ponds are required for the scheme at the scale on which they are sought;

- that the land which is proposed to be used for those measures is required for, and required to facilitate and/or is incidental to the scheme, such that the condition set out in subsection 122(2) is met; and
- that there is a compelling case in the public interest for the land to be acquired compulsorily, such that the condition set out in subsection 122(3) is met.

29. However, as explained above, the context for this position is as set out in Highways England's response to question 1.4.1 of the *Response to ExA's First Written Questions*.

### Temporary possession

30. The NFU contends (at paragraph 15 of its outline representations) that there is no power in the Planning Act 2008 by which a DCO may include powers of temporary use and possession of land. Highways England's response to this contention is as set out in detail in previous documentation, references to which are set out above. In short, however, the NFU's position on this matter is not accepted by Highways England.
31. Highways England's position with regard to temporary possession is that the creation of borrow pits and the extraction and use of minerals from them, and the creation of floodplain compensation areas, landscaping areas and construction areas are matters to which powers of temporary possession may apply. This is on the basis that they are matters which relate to, or are ancillary to the scheme, which is the development for which development consent is sought. Such matters therefore come within subsection 120(3) of the Planning Act 2008, which provides that "*an order granting development consent may make provision relating to, or to matters ancillary to, the development for which consent is granted*".
32. Further, subsection 120(4) provides that provision made under subsection 120(3) includes in particular provision for or relating to any of the matters listed in Part 1 of Schedule 5 of the Planning Act 2008. Paragraph 2 of Part 1 of Schedule 5 includes "*the creation, suspension or extinguishment of, or interference with, interests in or rights over land (including rights of navigation over water), compulsorily or by agreement*." Accordingly, it is Highways England's position that the creation of borrow pits and the use of minerals from them, and the creation of floodplain compensation areas, landscaping areas and construction areas are matters which can lawfully be included in the draft DCO for the scheme.

33. Further reasoning on the legality of the inclusion in a DCO of powers of temporary possession of land is set out in Highways England's *Response to the ExA's First Written Questions Report 4: Compulsory Acquisition* specifically in response to question 1.4.8 and paragraphs 63.4.29 to 63.4.44 of Highways England's response to the NFU's Written Representation, located in Highways England's *Response to Written Representations: Report 5 - Land Interests*.
34. The NFU alleges (at paragraph 16 of its outline representations) that Highways England:
- *"has failed to provide the affected owners and/or their agents with any feedback, response or analysis following earlier meetings and consultations";* and
  - *"shall not be authorised to acquire more land than is needed for the highway scheme itself."*
- and that –
- *"The plans and maps relied on [...] are not accurate and should not be used for the purposes of land acquisition, whether by the DCO itself, a notice to treat or a general vesting declaration."*
35. In response to these allegations, Highways England's position is that:
- it has engaged with the NFU and has responded to the NFU's requests for information, with the most recent meeting having been held on 4 August 2015. Further detail in response to this point is set out in Table 2.1, under the key topic heading 'Consultation' at page 13 of *Highways England's response to the A14 Agents Association and NFU*;
  - the authorisation of the amount of land in respect of which powers of compulsory acquisition are granted is a matter for the Secretary of State; and
  - the plans and maps submitted as part of the application for development consent represent the maximum extent of the land which Highways England would seek to acquire or possess temporarily pursuant to the DCO. As is explained at paragraph 2.4.12 of Highways England's *Response to Written Representations, Report 5 – Land Interests*, the actual land requirements would be defined by the detailed design of the scheme which would be finalised after the DCO was made (if development consent is granted) and plans used for the purposes of land acquisition or temporary possession would be drawn up at that time and on that basis.

## Minerals

36. Paragraphs 18 to 21 of the NFU's outline representations set out issues in relation to borrow pits, as follows:

- the NFU believes that there are local quarries and pits able to supply materials for the construction of the proposed highway scheme;
- prior to their extraction from the land, the sand, gravel and clay (together, 'the Minerals') come within the definition of 'land' for the purposes of section 159 and Part 7 of the Planning Act 2008; and
- article 21 of the DCO incorporates, with modifications, the Mining Code, the effect of which is that, "*to the extent that the Minerals are minerals within the meaning of the Code, they will be excluded from the powers of acquisition under the DCO and cannot be compulsorily acquired and therefore cannot be removed from any affected land*" and that therefore:
  - "*to the extent that Works 4.1 to 4.15 [the borrow pits] consist of the excavation and removal of the Minerals, such extent of the said Works should be excluded from the DCO, or,*
  - "*if such extent of the said Works is to be retained, then the Mining Code should not be incorporated, and the Minerals will have to be acquired and compensated for, and, in any event,*
  - "*entirely without prejudice to the case that the Planning Act 2008 contains no powers to include temporary possession powers, the DCO should be amended to provide for the payment of compensation for the excavation and removal of the Minerals in connection with the use of the temporary possession powers in Article 30.*"

37. Highways England's response to these points is as follows:

- Highways England does not consider that there are local quarries and pits able to supply materials for the construction of the proposed highway scheme. The reasons for this view are set out in Highways England's *Response to the ExA First Written Questions: Report 14 Other Matters*, at question 1.14.4 (Applicant reference HE/A14/EX/41, PINS reference REP2-015); and also in paragraph 63.4.22 of Highways England's *Response to Written Representations: Report 5 – Land Interests*.
- Section 159 (in Part 7 – Orders Granting Development Consent) of the Planning Act 2008, defines 'land' as '*includ[ing] any interest in or rights over land*', and does not exclude minerals from that definition.
- Highways England's position in relation to the incorporation of the Mining Code in the draft DCO and its application to the scheme is explained in Highways England's *Response to the ExA's First Written Questions: Report 4 Compulsory Acquisition*, at the



response to question 1.4.9; and also in Highways England's *Response to Relevant Representations* (Applicant reference HE/A14/EX/25, PINS reference REP1-035) at Tables 5-1 and 7-1. In summary, these documents explain that the incorporation of the Mining Code in the DCO would, if the DCO were made by the Secretary of State, entitle Highways England to extract minerals from within the plots of land identified as being necessary for use as borrow pits. It is Highways England's intention that the owners of minerals extracted for use in connection with the scheme shall be properly compensated in accordance with the Compensation Code and pursuant to section 126 of the Planning Act 2008.

38. The NFU concludes its outline representation by indicating its intention to "*represent that the DCO should be amended to reflect the matters set out above*". Highways England does not accept that the DCO should be amended in the manner suggested by the NFU and, in response to the issues raised by the NFU in its outline representation, Highways England maintains its position as set out in this response and in the documents cross-referred to herein.

## Question 2.4.5

**Whilst undertaking an accompanied site visit on 16th July 2015 the attention of the ExA was drawn to the proposed land take at the rear of 8 Station Cottages, Brampton Road, Huntingdon, which is to be used in connection with the construction of a new access to the station car park.**

**There are two rows of conifers at the rear of the property and it was not apparent from the plans whether the row of conifers nearest to the property (which form a natural screen) were included in the proposed land take or not. Can the applicant please clarify.**

## Response

39. The conifers in question are within the Development Consent Order boundary. The Environmental Statement (Applicant reference 6.1) assumes the existing vegetation, including the conifers, would be removed. Whilst this is the case, the detailed design of the station access would be developed to retain as many trees as practicable behind the cottages. The need to avoid unnecessary tree and vegetation removal and protection of existing trees is a requirement of the *Code of Construction Practice* (Applicant reference HE/A14/EX/64, PINS reference REP4-026) at paragraph 10.2.7, and compliance with this is secured by requirement 4 of Part 1 of Schedule 2 to the draft Development Consent Order (Applicant reference HE/A14/EX/59, PINS reference REP4-021).

## Question 2.4.6

**We refer to the relevant representation from Mr Robert Lenton of Corpus Christi Farm, Godmanchester (RR-466). Mr Lenton has concerns regarding the proposed provision for temporary and permanent access rights being acquired over plots 9/6, 9/11 and 9/14 and the configuration of the route. His concerns are set out in the representation (RR-466) sent by his agent Mr Michael Alexander dated 10th March 2015, which had attached to it a plan showing an alternative access over A – B (land which is in Mr Lenton's tenancy) and also an alternative railway bridge which is of greater width than that proposed to be used. Will the applicant consider Mr Lenton's concerns as expressed in the representation and discuss with him to see if a more acceptable alternative can be agreed which will accommodate both parties.**

## Response

40. This matter has been discussed with Mr Lenton and an alternative route for the access track agreed, which is reflected in the *Statement of Common Ground* with Mr Lenton that was submitted at Deadline 3 (Applicant reference HE/A14/EX/47, PINS reference REP3-009). The revised route uses the same existing bridge over the railway as shown on the Development Consent Order application drawings but runs in a direct line, along the northern edge of the field to the north of the farm, to access Offord Road. Highways England has submitted a request for the changes (change reference DR1.69) to the application documentation to the Examining Authority at Deadline 7 (Applicant reference HE/A14/EX/99), which are necessary to secure this solution.

### **Question 2.4.7**

**At Offord Hill cottage there is doubt owing to the scale of the Land Plans as to whether the hedge boundary adjacent to the highway is included in the proposed land take. It would clearly be of benefit to the cottage if it were not.**

**Will the applicant clarify whether or not the boundary hedge is excluded from the proposed land take.**

### **Response**

41. Highways England confirms that the existing hedge at Offord Hill Cottage will be retained and is not included in the proposed land take for the scheme.

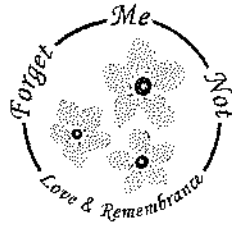

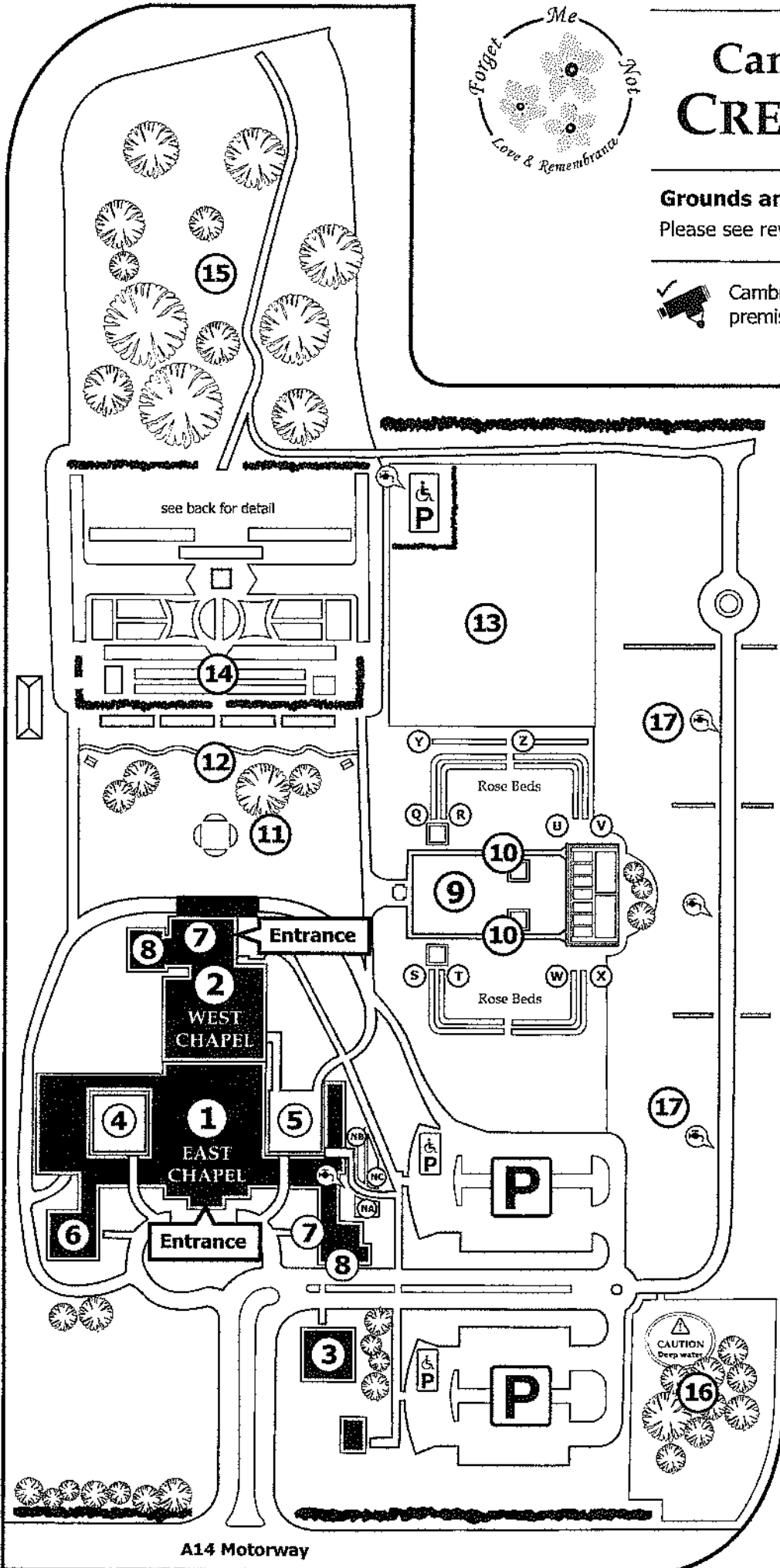
