Ref: A14- AFP713 (TR010018) Cambridge to Huntingdon Improvement Scheme Development Consent Order - Representation letter regarding impact of proposal on our property.

After recent discussions with Catherine King I am writing with regards to the above. During the many years this proposal for improvements has continued we have expressed our deep concerns over both the closeness and impact of the bypass to our property. We are the nearest residents to this scheme but there appears after discussions with Catherine King to be no notes of this or in fact when checking our property even appearing on the latest plans!

We have attended meetings and had a highways representative visit us to discuss the fact that we are in this very upsetting situation. After having realised, from the copy of Compulsory Purchase and Compensation, sent out to us over a year ago, our particular case does not appear to be covered in the quite limited existing categories. This was discussed at length with both Amanda Hawkins (via telephone 14/5/14) who had received our details from Geoff Dodgson after A14 presentation in Fenstanton at that time.

We feel that we have already been seriously affected by this proposed scheme even from the earliest stages as we were unable to sell our property without prospective buyers expressing concerns or being worried about the impact on our property. Nothing covers this situation at the present time under Sections 246a and leaves us feeling very neglected and angry. We strongly feel every individual case should be considered rather than have to fit in to pre- set "boxes" and that we are being totally neglected and our worries ignored.

This project has been discussed and documented locally and nationally for so many years now that there can be few people not aware of its proposal and whereabouts and yet individuals such as us, are having to suffer the impact on our property and lives mainly ignored at each stage of planning.

Please find attached a basic outline of our property and the area that it is situated in.
