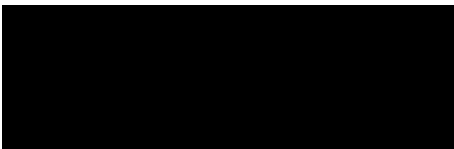
**A14 Cambridgeshire to Huntingdon Examination
Consent to Dis-apply Land Drainage Act**

I refer to the provision in the draft Development Consent Order (DCO) for the A14 Cambridge to Huntingdon Scheme.

The draft DCO provides for dis-application of various legislative provisions that are the subject of Prescribed Consents as defined in The Infrastructure Planning (Interested Parties and Miscellaneous Prescribed Provisions) Regulations 2015. Highways England has included in the draft DCO a Protective Provision relating to land drainage consent that has been agreed with the County Council.

The County Council therefore formally agrees to the dis-application of legislative provisions as set out in Article 3 of the Development Consent Order.
