## Summary of key points discussed and advice given:

The Applicant is aware of the Planning Inspectorate's openness policy that any advice given will be recorded and published on the planning portal website under s51 of the Planning Act 2008 (as amended) (PA 2008) and that any advice given does not constitute legal advice upon which the applicants (or others) can rely.

Introductions were made by everyone present, and individual roles were explained.

## **Redline Boundary Changes**

Highways England (HE) provided an update on the scheme development which included making changes to the redline boundary. These changes were explained as follows:

- Changes to the perimeter fence mitigation works, which changes the footprint of the project
- Refined route for private access track
- Additional land required to facilitate a change in the outfall route

All affected land owners have previously been consulted on the proposed A19 Testos Junction Improvement application under section 42 of the Planning Act 2008 and are aware of the proposed changes to the redline boundary. HE confirmed that no new consultees have been identified and as a result, are undertaking a targeted 28 day non-statutory consultation exercise. Letters enclosing an updated plan showing the

land required to construct the whole Scheme have been sent today to all persons with a category 1 or 2 interest in land required for the Scheme.

HE confirmed the non-statutory consultation process would be fully explained in the Consultation Report.

# **Draft Document Review**

The Planning Inspectorate confirmed comments on the draft Planning Statement will be provided as soon as practicable. HE confirmed a further suite of draft documents will be submitted for review, which will include the updated draft Development Consent Order, Explanatory Memorandum, Land and Works Plans.

## New submission date

The applicant advised that it expected to submit the application in July, once consultation had been completed.

# Specific decisions / follow up required?

PINS reminded the Applicant to inform the relevant Local Authorities (LAs) of their updated anticipated submission date; PINS would invite Adequacy of Consultation representations from the LAs when the application was received.
