Subject: A38 Behaviour Change Group - The Way Forward.

Hello everyone,

As you know, I attended the A38 Derby Junctions planning inspectors issue-specific hearing on 11th December, on behalf of Derby Cycling Group and raised the matter of the frustration of the A38 Behaviour Change Group (The Group), trying to engage with the project to understand how it might impact on our own organisations.

I was dismayed that both Highways England and Derby City Council wished to distance themselves from any role in coordinating The Group (which its self includes Derby City Council). As I understand it, the planning inspectors have no jurisdiction to require anyone to seek engagement with stakeholders; the view seems to be that the planning process has been followed and there have been opportunities to respond to consultation events.

However, I think many of us have issues, not necessarily with the specific elements of the design, but with the effects of the construction period on our organisation's operations. Others have only lately become aware of the likely impact of the project and would like to get more information and make input to the process.

Having spoken to several people at the meeting and having made a commitment at The Hearing:

I have a suggestion for how The Group could be organised and I am seeking Derby City Council and the A38 Derby Project Team's support for this proposal.

- **Derby City Council facilitate the meetings: arrange meeting dates, a venue, collate an agenda and make best endeavours to ensure that all organisations can be present.**
- **The A38 Derby Junctions project team make appropriate team members available to attend each meeting.**
- **Group members (which include Derby City Council), having taken on board the information provided by the A38 Derby Junctions team, then make their own representations to the project team regarding the issues they wish to discuss.**
 - **The last point is relevant because each organisation in The Group has different and specific issues relating to their own operations; so the bus company's issues will differ greatly from Royal Derby Hospital, University of Derby, Intu, etc.**
 - **It is therefore important to understand that Derby City Council will not be coordinating these specific issues on The Group's behalf; as members we have a responsibility to pursue these ourselves.**
 - **Having said that, certain major items (such as a congestion mitigation plan) are of general relevance and, in my opinion, will need to have strong City Council engagement and should be discussed at The Group meeting. The problem (congestion) may be caused by the project, but the effects will be felt by the people and organisations in Derby City (and beyond); a collaborative approach is needed.**

Could Nigel Brien from Derby City Council and somebody from the A38 Derby Projects team please let us know if this is a process which you could support.

Finally I would like to add that Derby Cycling Group is an entirely voluntary organisation and although we are participating enthusiastically and positively in the consultation process have no resources to coordinate The Group. We do however intend to contribute as much as we can to the planning process in regard to our own capacity. However the issue of congestion mitigation is a specific area which causes us great concern and is one which we do not think is being addressed at the moment.

Hello Everyone,

Last Wednesday I attended the A38 Derby Junctions planning inspectorate Issue Specific Hearing, as a representative of Derby Cycling Group. The hearing was convened by the team who are inspecting the Highways England project to create grade separated junctions at the Kingsway, Markeaton and Little Eaton roundabouts.

I raised the matter of this group (the A38 Behaviour Change group) trying to get information regarding the project and wanting to make input to the planning process to make sure that our organisations are able to plan for the anticipated congestion which seems inevitable during the four year construction period of the scheme. I said that we were concerned at the difficulty we have had getting Highways England and Derby City Council to organise meetings to enable that to happen, following the initial two meetings.

The chair of the hearing, Stuart Cowperthwaite, noted that the Group members are wishing to engage with the project and said he regarded the input as important, and he noted that we are having difficulty doing this so he has offered to allow members to submit a response to the Traffic Management Plan, even if they are not currently registered as an "interested party" within the planning inspection process. **This must be done no later than Thursday 19th December, 2019** because that is the next deadline in the planning inspection process.

I urge all members of the A38 Behaviour Change group to read the Traffic Management Plan, via the link below, and submit your organisation's own response to it, including any amendments you would like included.

Hello,

It is inevitable that those who work and/or live in Derby are concerned about the impact the A38 works will have on travel. This is why the A38 Behaviour Change Group was formed; to be able to come together to communicate with Highways England. I have spoken to Nigel Brien, our head of department, who has asked me to relay the following to you:

'We invited various interested parties within Derby to join together to have direct contact with Highways England about the impacts of construction and the specific mitigations for public transport, key businesses, health services, education, etc. However, this is not a group where the Council asks the participants to tell us what they want, and then we negotiate with Highways England on behalf of the group. The Council will have representatives at the meetings, but the group needs to also include Highways England. They should be able to use this group to listen to the critical concerns and understand what mitigations will be required to assist people to make different journey choices and if possible provide incentives, information and perhaps direct support to key stakeholders.

The Behaviour Change Group, needs to agree it's terms of reference and scope, and probably determine a structure. There will be various conversations at different levels taking place between Highways England, statutory bodies, and the Council; this is partly as a result of the formal Department for Transport processes and obviously because various bodies have statutory duties. These processes will take place in parallel to the Behaviour Change Group, and will be better placed to argue for some physical and operational elements – e.g. minor road changes, elements that need to be restricted in the planning process, etc. The Council officers at the Behaviour Change Group can obviously liaise with the group and across the wide range of council services involved and effected, to add some degree of coordination.

Highways England suggested they wanted engagement with key local organisations and interests beyond the Council. This was the initial stimulus for establishing the group, not so that the Council could lead, but so that there was a forum for Highways England to meet face to face and negotiate with the city wide interests.

At the next meeting there is clearly a need for the group to discuss the purpose, and structure, and perhaps some key priorities.'

I hope this provides some clarification.

Kerrie,

I fully understand that this is outside of your control but this feels like the proverbial can being kicked down the road. You are correct that this is a HE project but it is Derby's problem. This is the biggest infrastructure project in Derby since the completion of the inner ring road and it is bigger than that. It will have massive consequences on congestion and reduced air quality for large parts of the city for four years.

There must be someone who is senior to Zoe who can meet with concerned parties to share what is going on and what the issues are. If we are going to involve communities and stakeholders in mapping out what the mitigations could be then that needs to happen asap. If the mitigations involve any physical measures then they will take time to plan and design so again we are running short of time.

I would appreciate the communication but would like a meeting with someone who has oversight of the project as soon as possible to discuss the plans both as a key stakeholder and local resident.
