We refer to the further written questions raised by the Inspectors on 5<sup>th</sup> May 2020. EGL would like to comment as follows upon the three questions raised at section 8.1 of the document:

- Qu a) The main issue relates to the suitability of the proposed access from the A52 to safely serve the EGL/McDonalds site. The Applicant has written to EGL to confirm that they are seeking comments directly relating to the proposed access alterations from Derby City Council (DCiC) as the appropriate Highway Authority for the relevant section of the A52 and they would be required to maintain the public highway element of the scheme. A response is awaited from the Applicant before progress can be made. It would be premature to consider potential alterations to the access scheme until after a response from DCiC
- Qu b) The issue of rights is primarily for McDonalds. EGL has existing internal rights over the restaurant plot that appear capable of accommodating the new scheme. If any amendments are proposed to the internal routes however these would be best addressed now to resolve these issues and not left for subsequent discussion given that compensation arising from amendments may be substantial.
- Qu c) EGL has made direct requests of the Applicant to clarify the position in respect of the Advanced Warning Signage and again a response from the appropriate branch within Highway England is eagerly awaited.

Any further progress in relation to the Statement of Common Ground is dependent upon receipt of responses in relation to the issues commented upon above.
