A303 Amesbury to Berwick Down Application for Development Consent – Deadline 7 Submission

• Final Statements of Common Ground

We enclose revised updated Statements of Common Ground (SoCG) between Highways England and the following Interested Parties:

Wiltshire Council; Winterbourne Stoke Parish Council; English Heritage; Historic England; RSPB; Natural England; Environment Agency; National Trust; and NFU

All SoCGs apart from the SoCG with RSPB (which has been approved at officer level but still requires final approval by RSPB's legal department), still have matters that remain under discussion. Since those discussions will continue, in order to continue to narrow down the issues for the ExA, the Applicant plans to submit updated SoCGs at subsequent deadlines.

In addition, three landowners, Mr Philip Sawkill, Ms Pamela Sandell, and Mr Robin Parsons have requested that the outstanding issues with them be captured in a SoCG. These are in the process of being prepared and will be submitted to the Examining Authority at or before Deadline 8.

Stone Curlew Plot Update

As stated in its responses to the Examining Authority's Second Written Questions Ec.2.1-2.4 [REP6-024] and in the HRSA Clarification Note - stone curlew plot sift submitted at Deadline 6 [REP6-039], Highways England is currently in the process of identifying suitable land parcels on which to provide the proposed two additional stone curlew plots proposed. As per the criteria set out in those submissions, relevant landowners in the SPA+5km zone and within 5km of the Scheme have been contacted to date, starting with those nearest to Normanton Down RSPB reserve. As expected, multiple landowners have responded positively and where they have, specific locations for the plots have been selected and farm visits are being undertaken to further discuss the options for plots. RSPB is involved in verifying the suitability of plots. A further update on this matter will be provided at Deadline 8.

Response to English Heritage objection to PRoW to Visitor Centre

This report responds to English Heritage's Deadline 2 submissions (see English Heritage's Written Representation, in particular Appendix 2 (a report by Momentum Transport Consultancy [REP2-092]) and Appendix 3 (Safety Audit [REP2-090]), which object to part of the Applicant's proposals for a new public right of way in parallel with the A360, providing new restricted byway links to the Stonehenge Visitor Centre, as comprised in the Applicant's original DCO application (and shown on Sheet 14 of the Rights of Way and Access Plans [APP-009]).

The issue of the proposed PRoW route was discussed at the Issue Specific Hearing 6 – Traffic & Transport, held on 13 June and also at the Compulsory Acquisition Hearing 1, held on 9 and 10 July 2019, when the Applicant committed (see REP5-002 at page 2-34) to provide a detailed written response to the issues raised by English Heritage. This report comprises that response. It demonstrates that the concerns raised by English Heritage are unfounded and/or capable of being appropriately addressed or mitigated. In so doing, the report also explains the Applicant's endeavours to develop an alternative PRoW proposal which addresses these concerns and describes the two options which have emerged from that process (selected from eleven potential solutions) to form the 'non-material change' proposals on which the Applicant is currently consulting, and which are presented (as reference NMC-06, Options A and B) in the Applicant's Proposed Changes Application which was submitted on 5 August 2019 [AS-066 and AS-097].

Illustrated Examples of Key Design Elements

This document presents illustrations which show how key elements of the Scheme could look, when designed in compliance with the Vision, Design Principles and Commitments presented in Chapter 4 of the Outline Environmental Management Plan (OEMP). This has been produced following stakeholder consultation regarding the Scheme-wide Vision and Design Principles.



The intention is for this document to be included in the appendices of the next iteration of the OEMP, as referred to in paragraph 4.3.2 of the Deadline 6 OEMP [REP6-011].
