REQUEST FOR FINAL COMMENTS ON REPRESENTATIONS RECEIVED IN RESPONSE TO THE SECRETARY OF STATE'S CONSULTATION LETTER OF 16 JULY 2020

Archaeological Find with the World Heritage Site

Following a recent archaeological find within the World Heritage Site, the Secretary of State's consultation letter of 16 July 2020 sought comments from certain Interested Parties on matters raised in the Hidden Landscapes Project report and representations relating to the archaeological find and its: i) implications for the Development and any harm it may cause to the World Heritage Site; and ii) implications for the Applicant's Environmental Statement, including the Heritage Impact Assessment, and the proposed Detailed Archaeological Mitigation Strategy.

The representations received in response to the Secretary of State's consultation letter have now been published on the project page for the A303 Stonehenge Development Consent Order ("DCO") on the Planning Inspectorate's website at:

https://infrastructure.planninginspectorate.gov.uk/projects/south-west/a303-stonehenge/. The Secretary of State would be grateful if **the Applicant**, **Historic England**, **Wiltshire Council and other recipients** could provide any final comments they have on those representations.

Other Information Received by the Secretary of State

The Secretary of State considers the Applicant's response to the above consultation on the archaeological find contains other substantive information in relation to the environmental statement (defined as "any other information") under the Infrastructure Planning (Environmental Impact Assessment) Regulations 2017. However, the Secretary of State has asked the Applicant to advertise the annexed notice of that other information as if it were "further information" as defined under the Infrastructure Planning (Environmental Impact Assessment) Regulations 2017. **Copy recipients** are invited to comment on the other information produced by the Applicant.

DCO Drafting - Articles 22 and 50

Pinsent Masons, who act on behalf of the Applicant, has also made a separate representation dated 11 August 2020, which is published alongside this letter. The representation is in respect of a DCO drafting issue, relating to Articles 22 and 50 in the draft DCO concerning the compulsory acquisition of rights for the benefit of parties other than Highways England, specifically where rights are required:

- for the benefit of statutory undertakers whose apparatus is to be diverted in consequence of the scheme; and
- for the benefit of persons with an interest in land, the private means of access to which are proposed to be stopped up and subsequently re-provided across other land, which is not proposed to be acquired outright by Highways England.

The representation also includes the Applicant's updated draft Explanatory Memorandum, that accompanied its draft DCO.

The Applicant has asked that the drafting considerations raised in our letter be taken into account by Secretary of State. **Recipients and copy recipients** are invited to submit any comments they may have on the representation.

To align consultation on the above matters, the deadline for any response is Monday 28 September 2020.

To assist the Secretary of State, any reliance on information containing in previous representations made either during or since the examination should also include the relevant document reference number(s).

NOTICE REGARDING SUBMISSION BY HIGHWAYS ENGLAND OF OTHER SUBSTANTIVE INFORMATION UNDER THE INFRASTRUCTURE PLANNING (ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACT ASSESSMENT) REGULATIONS 2017

Notice is hereby given of publication of other substantive information provided by Highways England of Temple Quay House, 2 The Square, Temple Quay, Bristol BS1 6HA ("the Applicant") in relation to the environmental statement submitted in support of its application for a Development Consent Order ("DCO") under the Planning Act 2008 ("the Application") for the Amesbury to Berwick Down Scheme (accepted for examination under application reference TR010025).

The Applicant considers that information it has provided to the Secretary of State for Transport in response to his letter dated 16 July 2020 (which sought comments from the Applicant and other interested parties on new archaeological matters) is other substantive information ("Other Information") but is treating it as if it were further environmental information under the Infrastructure Planning (Environmental Impact Assessment) Regulations 2017 and therefore invites any comments from interested parties on the Other Information, to be submitted to the Secretary of State for Transport c/o The Planning Inspectorate by no later than 23:59 on 28 September 2020. The Secretary of State currently has a deadline of 13 November 2020 by which to determine the Application.

The Other Information relates to the recent archaeological discovery by the Hidden Landscapes Project, which relates to a series of pits in proximity to Durrington Walls Henge.

The Other Information is set out in the following documents: -

- Highways England's overarching response;
- Environmental Statement (ES) Addendum; and
- Heritage Impact Assessment (HIA) Addendum.

Summary of the Project

The Application seeks development consent for the A303 Amesbury to Berwick Down Scheme in the south-west region, located within the administrative area of Wiltshire Council.

The DCO would authorise the creation of a high quality two-lane dual carriageway on the A303 trunk road between Amesbury and Berwick Down in Wiltshire ("the Scheme"). The Scheme would be approximately 8 miles (13km) long and would comprise the following key components:

- a) A northern bypass of Winterbourne Stoke with a viaduct over the River Till valley;
- b) A new junction between the A303 and A360 to the west of and replacing the existing Longbarrow roundabout;
- c) A twin-bore tunnel approximately 2 miles (3.3km) long, past Stonehenge; and
- d) A new junction between the A303 and A345 at the existing Countess roundabout.

If the DCO is made by the Secretary of State for Transport, it would allow Highways England, for the purpose of constructing, operating and maintaining the Scheme, to acquire compulsorily interests in and rights over land, including the power to create and acquire new rights over land, and to take possession of and to use land temporarily. The DCO would also make provision for development, which would constitute associated development together with other ancillary matters, including those related to the diversion and stopping up of lengths of existing highways in the vicinity of the route, the classification and reclassification of highways including the trunking and de-trunking of sections of highway, the application of speed limits, the stopping up of private means of access and the creation of new private means of access, and the application and disapplication of legislation relating to the project.

Environmental Impact Assessment Development and Other Information

The proposed works are environmental impact assessment development for the purpose of the Infrastructure Planning (Environmental Impact Assessment) Regulations 2017 and accordingly an environmental statement (ES) accompanies the Application.
