Under your consultation members of Durrington Town Council and some members of the Public have studied your consultation documents and all agree that the New Archaeological finds described under Other Information will have no effect on the proposed A303 development nor will the A303 development affect the new finds described in Other Information.

What we have noticed recently is an increase in MOP visiting Durrington Walls and Woodhenge. This could be due to the increase in National Publicity given to the area.

What local people are concerned about is the increase in traffic especially on Fridays and Sunday afternoons passing through the Bulford Durrington and Larkhill bypassing the traffic holdups alongside Stonehenge on A303. The Council has been approached to investigate the installation of Traffic calming method's and reduction in speed limits to reduce the impact of bypass traffic.
