I refer to my previous email, dated 25th July re the above and to yours of 8th December. Re-consideration of the plan to deal with the issue is a good reason to consider this plan. I have taken the road a few times and on each occasion there has been a slow moving traffic or a traffic jam for the length of road from which Stonehenge is visible. I take it that the traffic problems are directly attributable to “rubber necking”: slowing down to take in the view. My answer is that a line of trees be planted to obscure/hide the view of Stonehenge from the road. Such would clear the traffic problem and enhance the environment. Traffic disruption during the construction would be minimal and the cost greatly reduced. I believe that my plan has merit of being simple, inexpensive and capable of being implemented quickly and with the minimum of disruption. I leave my thoughts with you and hope that they are useful.
