[REDACTED] I am a concerned citizen and would like point out the following points:

National Highways has not:

Made any changes the Scheme to take the 2021 World Heritage Committee decision into account

Acknowledged that the Secretary of State found the impact on the proposed Western cutting would be "significantly adverse"

Fully assigned alternatives less damaging to the World Heritage Site eg a southern longer route even if there might be some problems with it while a longer tunnel would reduce the impact on the World Heritage Site

Explore alternatives to hard engineering solutions in the interest of safeguarding and enhancing the World Heritage Site eg a package of measures to reduce road traffic road emissions and improve access to the South West

Update the Scheme costs

Update the carbon assessment and costs

Other changes from the Examination Board.

There is also:

Concern for Climate Change has increased with the latest Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change report and the need to take urgent action to reduce emissions. This Scheme would increase emissions.

The Environment Act of 2021 sets new standards about nature recovery.

All in all this motorway under Stonehenge is a terrible idea for British and indeed World Heritage. What on earth are the government playing at?? The motorway should go on the Southend where there are a lot less archaeological artefacts.
