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I am amazed that the proposals for the tunnel near Stonehenge are still being considered, and that the matter was not closed after the previous decision not to go ahead, given the archaeological importance of the site, that it could lose its World Heritage status, and that there are less destructive alternatives. And a tunnel near Stonehenge would in no way address the problems of other parts of the A303 which are single carriageway. It seems a complete waste of money as well as wanton destruction of an important site.

I have to drive across the A303 regularly, and it is very busy, and there can be slow traffic, and often the roundabout is jammed. But at some point we have to accept that this is what it is like in a small country, with a lot more traffic on the roads than there used to be. To continue to carve up what is left of open spaces - particularly those of prime heritage importance - is not the right way forward. A much better public transport system should be considered first.
