I am extreamly anxious about plans for further very extensive construction work in the area of Stonehenge, a site which I first saw in all it's glory more than 70 years ago, a time when passing traffic was negligable, & there were no attendant 'facilities' to spoil the visual impact of this amazing construction, now rightly recognised as a major world heritage site.

As you will know there is an area deemed the 'Stonehenge World Heritage site boundary'. Surely all of this relatively small area should now be sacrosanct from any further encroachment by modern-day construction activity.

In support of this I would remind you that modern archeological research keeps adding to the many reasons why there should be no further impingement on it, both recent work at Durrington Walls, & that re-interpreting the actual purpose of the monument, support the view that there should be no further invasive consruction in this area. One that undoubtedly still has much more to tell us about our past if it's not vandalised in the name of progress.

I suggest to you that a proper future for this unique treasure would be best acheived by concentrating funding not on tunnels, but on a plan to move all through traffic to roads built outside the perimeter of this site boundary, & such roads as exist within it, now be designated purely as seperate visitors access routes with no interconnecting function between them so as to avoid any through traffic usage.
