Dear Sir,

I am contacting you about my deep concern regarding the proposed road and its impact on Stonehenge. and the surrounding area.. As you will be aware Liverpool has already lost its UNESCO protection due to over-development. I am currently involved in attempting to prevent the construction of a vast EfW incinerator adjacent to the at present, UNESCO protected Jurassic Coast. The thought of an additional 202,000 tonnes of GHG carbon dioxide being released into the air annually by an incinerator that local residents who love the iconic Isle of Portland do not need, is another concern of mine. Private companies and contractors should not be profiting by ruining our heritage.

With regard to Stonehenge, the inescapable facts of the situation have led UNESCO's World Heritage Committee on 22 July 2021) to confirm that if the outcome of Save Stonehenge WHS's legal challenge allows the A303 Stonehenge scheme to proceed and if the scheme is not modified, consideration will be given to placing Stonehenge, Avebury and Associated Sites on the List of World Heritage in Danger next year.

We owe it to the next generation to preserve our precious heritage.
