**Planning Act 2008 (as amended) and the Infrastructure Planning (Examination Procedure) Rules 2010**

**Application by National Highways (“the Applicant”) for an Order granting Development Consent for the construction of a new two-lane dual carriage way for the A303 between Amesbury and Berwick Down in Wiltshire.**

The Directors of Save Stonehenge World Heritage Site wish to inform you that they fully endorse the submissions of The Stonehenge Alliance (ref. 2001870) in respect of the Secretary of State’s request of 24.2.22 for comments from all interested parties on his Statement of Matters of 30.11.21 and the Applicant’s response to the same of 11.1.22 and 8.2.22.
