Dear Planning Inspector,

I reiterate my strong objection to any proposed tunnel through the historic and unique Stonehenge site. I find it hard to understand that the government is still proposing a "revised" scheme when the judge has ruled against the Government's proposal. A very experienced engineer gave advice to the Government that a tunnel should not be constructed due to the steep slope from the stones down to the A303 which would always cause severe flooding of a tunnel during heavy rainfall. The likelihood of more heavy rainfall in the future has been confirmed by scientists who have studied the effects of Climate Change.

Also the public need to be aware that if a tunnel were constructed, Stonehenge will lose its World Heritage Status, which would be an international archaeological catastrophe.
