Dear Sir

I have seen the widespread mayhem of the landscape when major roads are being built eg M3 through the South Downs.

I am firmly of the opinion that the Stonehenge complex can only become more complex and revealing of our common heritage as more technology and occasional digging explodes our knowledge of this World Heritage Site. We may even lose this status if we persevere with the present plan. The last ten years have revealed more and more of the complexity and indeed European dimensions of our past.

The present road is indeed wholly inadequate and is an inefficient highway. It needs to be re routes much farther away from this complex of ancient evidence. A tunnel might well prove catastrophic.

Be far more radical. Current and future generations will think we were crazy if we mess with this landscape.
