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To the Planning Inspectorate,

I email you to ask for a re-examination of the Development Consent Order in respect of the routing of the A303 around Stonehenge.

I draw your attention to the following specific points in regard to the Response of the National Highways (“NH”) to the request of the Secretary of State:

1. NH has not made any changes to the Scheme to take into account the 2021 Decision of the World Heritage Committee;
2. NH has not fully assessed alternative routes less damaging to the World Heritage Site, such as, for example, a Southern by-pass route or a longer tunnel;
3. NH has not update the Scheme construction costs, nor updated the carbon assessment and costs – reducing carbon emissions is a matter of increased concern in the light of the latest report of the Inter-governmental Panel on Climate Change.

I ask again, please, for a re-examination of the DCO. The omission of current cost estimates, UNESCO’s position and new information since the Examination closed in October 2019, are – I suggest – compelling grounds for a re-examination by an independent panel before the Secretary of State re-determines an application for a DCO for the very same road scheme.
