Dear Secretary of State,

I am responding to your request for comments from Interested Parties on the Applicant's response to the Final Report on the joint World Heritage Centre / ICOMOS / ICCROM Advisory Mission to Stonehenge, Avebury and Associated Sites (c.373bis) 19 - 21 April 2022.

I have read the <u>Report of the Advisory Mission</u> and agree with its principal finding, that the scheme would have an adverse impact on the OUV of the WHS, that a southern bypass should be further explored and, at the very least, the western limit of the tunnel should be extended to the WHS boundary.

In response the Applicant has reiterated the arguments it has raised previously to justify a scheme which is clearly unacceptable to UNESCO's World Heritage Committee.

The High Court judgment quashed the DCO in part because the Transport Secretary had not given proper consideration to alternatives. This remains, and will remain, the case until the transport problem is looked at afresh through a new options' appraisal.

What I have read has not caused me to alter my stance submitted on 31 March 2022; I therefore continue to object to the proposals, which should be abandoned.
