This response takes no account of the High Court judgment that the Transport Secretary had not given proper consideration to alternatives.

Instead, the response reiterates the same arguments that the Government's independent specialist examiners and UNESCO's World Heritage Committee have already found to be unacceptable, incomplete and insufficiently studied and analysed.

I trust that this A303 scheme will now be the subject of another formal public Examination so that all of the new information submitted by National Highways and others since 2020 may be fully and openly presented, analysed and discussed.

The scheme, as currently proposed, continues to pose seriously-adverse risks to the World Heritage Site at Stomehenge.

In the light of all the new information and submissions that have been made, by many parties,

I urge you to recommend that a southern bypass route should be further explored.
