I am writing to encourage you to explore the southern bypass option for the A303 (a road I've traveled many times over the years). I understand that this is the principle finding of the report of the Advisory Mission.

The voices against the current proposal (our own independent specialist examiners, UNESCO's World Heritage Committee, and the former Transport Secretary should be listened to as regards this unique landscape and piece of Britain's heritage..

I note also that the High Court judgment quashed the DCO in part because the Transport Secretary had not given proper consideration to alternatives and also that National Highways' response fails to alleviate any of the concerns of these opponents.

I object to the proposals and hope that the scheme will be abandoned and trust that, should the Transport Secretary intend to proceed with the scheme, it will be subject of another formal public Examination so that all of the new information submitted by National Highways and others since 2020 may be fully and openly discussed, and taken into account and advised upon by the Government's independent Planning Inspectorate.
