I support the principal finding of the Advisory Mission that the scheme as proposed adversely affects the Stonehenge World Heritage Site. A southern bypass should be further investigated to avoid irreparable damage to such an immensely important site.

Should a tunnel still be adopted it needs to be more extensive so that no part of the road intrudes on the WHS.

The High Court has already found against the Development Consent Order, stating that the Transport Secretary had not given proper consideration to alternatives. Such consideration must now be given to schemes that would be much less damaging to one of the most important and iconic sites in our heritage.

UNESCO's World Heritage Committee is opposed to the scheme as currently proposed, as were the specialist independent advisors appointed by the Government. The Government should be preserving our heritage not damaging it.

I object to the Government's proposals and hope that the road tunnel is abandoned in favour of a southern bypass which does not impinge on the site.
