Dear Sirs,

Having read the Advisory Mission report I have the following comments.

National Highways is simply repeating the arguments it has raised previously and fails to alleviate concerns.

The scheme is clearly unacceptable to the government's independent specialist examiners, UNESCO's World Heritage Committee, and the former Transport Secretary who agreed with the examining panel that the scheme would be significantly adverse overall.

The High Court judgment quashed the DCO in part because the Transport Secretary had not given proper consideration to alternatives - including a southern bypass.

The Mission has admitted that the western limit of the tunnel should be extended to the WHS boundary.

Before proceeding with the scheme there must be another formal public Examination so that all of the new information submitted by National Highways and others since 2020 may be fully and openly discussed, and taken into account and advised upon by the Government's independent Planning Inspectorate.

I object to the proposals and ask that the scheme will be abandoned.
