Dear Sir

I remain concerned about the proposed road tunnel scheme under the Stonehenge site, and would ask you to give proper consideration to the following points:

Having read the **Lagree** with its principal finding - that the scheme would have an adverse impact on the OUV of the WHS and that a southern bypass should be further explored.

The Mission admitted that at the very least the western limit of the tunnel should be extended to the WHS boundary.

As you are aware, National Highways has simply reiterated many of the arguments it has raised previously to justify a scheme which is clearly unacceptable to:

- o Government's independent specialist examiners,
- o UNESCO's World Heritage Committee, and

• the former Transport Secretary himself who agreed with the examining panel that the scheme would be "significantly adverse" overall.

The High Court judgment quashed the DCO in part because the Transport Secretary had not given proper consideration to alternatives.

I trust that you will reconsider the proposal and take action to instigate a viable alternative.
