Dear Sirs,

I remain **VERY CONCERNED** about the proposal to construct a tunnel and two way highway through the World Heritage Site at Stonehenge.

It is disturbing that National Highways are choosing to ignore the findings of UNESCO's Advisory Mission, which found that the scheme would have an adverse impact on the OUV of the WHS.

I support the Mission's proposal that the idea of a southern bypass should be investigated . Alternatively, the proposed tunnel should be extended to the WHS boundary at the western end.

National Highways haven't provided satisfactory answers to the concerns raised by UNESCO, five Planning Inspectors and even the former Transport Secretary.

I continue to **OBJECT** to the proposed scheme.

Should a decision be made for the plan to proceed, I trust that it will be the subject of a new **FORMAL PUBLIC EXAMINATION** so that information which has come to light since 2020 can be discussed.
