Dear Planning Inspectorate,

The A303 Stonehenge road scheme has been rejected by UNESCO and 5 planning Inspectors.

Additionally, nearly quarter of a million concerned citizens globally have lodged objections to this destructive scheme.

There are alternatives; how can opting for the 'cheapest' route be a permitted solution to traffic control when this involves irreparable damage impact to a unique and globally recognised site?

Consent was quashed by the High Court. The Advisory Mission stated that a southern bypass should be considered further.

National Highways appear deaf and unconcerned despite the huge level of rational and considered objections by many bodies to the current scheme.

There are alternatives. National Highways must be legally obliged to reconsider their current and unacceptable plan.
