Dear Rt Hon Anne-Marie Trevelyan MP,

Regarding the National Highways' submission on the A303 road scheme: I continue to object to the proposals and hope that the scheme will be abandoned.

A few basic and very cheap ideas have not been trialled:

- Making the East to West A303 between the two roundabouts, end-gating the World Heritage site, a single-carriage way through it's length. Part of the log jam is caused by the double-carriage way becoming a single one and cars failing to let others in.
- Secondly just screen off the World Heritage site!! So many cars slow down to almost nothing to 'rubber neck'. With trees (perhaps a hoarding first until these grow up) the traffic would flow much faster and smoothly.

A cost of perhaps several £100,000 . Please explain me why these 2 ideas have not been trialled.
