I have heard that UNESCO's Advisory Mission's report has advised that a less damaging scheme, such as a southern bypass, should be sought and indicated that, at the very least, any tunnel should be extended to the western WHS boundary. I agree with this advice and feel that the proposed scheme would have an adverse impact on a treasured National Monument and that a southern bypass should be further explored or that at the *very least* the western limit of the tunnel should be extended to the WHS boundary.

National Highways' response fails to alleviate any of the above concerns. I continue to object to the proposals and hope that the scheme will be abandoned.

Should the Transport Secretary intend to proceed with the scheme, I trust that it will be subject of another formal public Examination so that all of the new information submitted by National Highways and others since 2020 may be fully and openly discussed, and taken into account and advised upon by the Government's independent Planning Inspectorate.
