Dear Transport Secretary,

Regarding building works for the A303/Stonehenge site, I read the Advisory Mission report, and I am in agreement that a southern bypass should be further explored. It is clear that that the scheme would have an adverse impact on the OUV of the WHS

The response of National Highways does not adequately address any of the concerns raised. The views of important, experienced groups and figures to this scheme are unanimous in their objection to it; this includes the Government's own independent specialist examiners; UNESCO's World Heritage Committee; and the former Transport Secretary himself, who agreed with the examining panel that the scheme would be "significantly adverse" overall.

I object to the scheme very strongly. I trust that, if it does go ahead, there will be another formal public Examination to take into account all of the new information submitted since 2020.
