Dear Mr or Ms,

I'm following up the Transport Secretary's invitation to comment on National Highways's comments on road relief measures on the A303 near Stonehenge.

I cannot agree with the content of National Highways' rehashed comments.

Stonehenge is designated to be a World Heritage Site and as such demands careful and thoughtful solutions to achieve minimal disturbance to the environment of the monument and its surroundings.

There is a large number of bodies to which the proposal is unacceptable including the Government's own independent advisors, UNESCO's World Heritage Site Mission and the comments of the former Transport Secretary that the Scheme would have a significantly adverse outcome. It is also noteworthy that the High Court quashed the Development Consent Order because the former Transport Secretary had not given proper consideration to alternatives.
