- The former Transport Secretary who agreed the plans were "Significantly adverse" when considered overall

In my opinion, to rush blindly into the Tunnel scheme would be a failure in the proper consideration of the value of the World Heritage Site and the surrounding landscape.

A Southern bypass would be a possible solution and should be considered as an alternative-
