Dear Rt Honourable Anne-Trevelyan MP,

Having read the Advisory Mission report, I agree wholeheartedly with its main finding that the present scheme would have an adverse impact on the Outstanding Universal Value of the Stonehenge World Heritage Site and that a southern bypass should be further explored.

In its latest submission, I note with dismay that the National Highways Agency has merely repeated many of the arguments it previously raised to try to justify the scheme and which have been seen as unacceptable to the Government's specialist examiners, UNESCO's World Heritage Committee and the former Transport Secretary, who agreed with the examining panel that the scheme would be 'significantly adverse' overall.

As you will be aware, the High Court squashed the Direct Consent Order, partly because the Transport Secretary had not sufficiently considered alternatives. There is nothing in National Highways new response, which alleviates any of the concerns mentioned above.

I remain vehemently opposed to the scheme and sincerely hope that it will be abandoned. I trust that if the Transport Secretary intends to proceed that all of the new information submitted by the interested parties be the subject of further public examination, be fully and openly discussed, taken account of and advised upon by the Government's Independent Planning Inspectorate.
