To Whom it May Concern,

I have read the UNESCO Advisory Mission report on the current proposal and I agree with its principal finding, which is that the scheme would have an adverse impact on the Outstanding Universal Value of the site and that options regarding a southern bypass should be further explored.

National Highways has simply reiterated many of the arguments it has raised previously to justify a scheme which is clearly unacceptable to Government's independent specialist examiners and UNESCO's World Heritage Committee.

The High Court judgement quashed the DCO in part because the Transport Secretary had not given proper consideration to alternatives.

I continue to object to the proposals and hope that the scheme will be abandoned.

Should the Transport Secretary intend to proceed with the scheme, I trust that it will be subject to another formal public examination so that all the new information submitted by National Highways and others since 2020 may be fully and openly discussed, and taken into account by the Government's independent Planning Inspectorate.
