Dear Anne-Marie Trevelyan,

I have read the Advisory Mission's report and agree with its principal finding, which is that the scheme would adversely impact the O.U.V. of the World Heritage Site, and that a Southern bypass should be

explored further. The Mission agreed that at the very least the Western limit of the tunnel should be extended to the W.H.S. boundary. National Highways has merely repeated several of the arguments it

has previously made to justify a scheme which is clearly unacceptable to the Government's independent specialist examiners, to the UNESCO World Heritage Committee, and to the former Transport

Secretary who agreed with the examining panel that the scheme would be "significantly adverse overall".

The High Court judgement quashed the D.C.O. in part because the Transport Secretary had not given proper consideration to alternatives.

National Highways' response fails to alleviate any of the above concerns.

I continue to object to these proposals, and I hope that the scheme will be abandoned.
