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1 Introduction

1.1 Purpose of this document

- 1.1.1 This document is a Statement of Common Ground (SoCG) between Highways England and Truro Cycling Campaign in relation to the A30 Chiverton to Carland Cross scheme. It has been prepared in accordance with DCLG (now Ministry of Housing, Communities and Local Government) guidance on the pre-application process¹.
- 1.1.2 The document identifies the following between the two parties:
 - Matters which have been agreed
 - Matters currently outstanding (subject to negotiation or not agreed)
- 1.1.3 The SoCG will continue to evolve as the application for development consent progresses through the Examination stage.

1.2 Structure of this SoCG

- 1.2.1 The SoCG is structured as follows:
 - Section 2 states the role of Truro Cycling Campaign in the application and sets out the consultation undertaken from 2017.
 - Section 3 presents the topics covered in this SoCG.
 - Section 4 lists those matters which have been agreed, including the date that this matter was agreed.
 - Section 5 is a table of matters outstanding, incorporating a description of the matter, the position of Truro Cycling Campaign, the position of Highways England and any actions taken to address the matter, and the date of the latest position including any further meetings planned regarding the matter.

1.3 Status of this SoCG

- 1.3.1 A draft of this document was issued to Truro Cycling Campaign on 14 March 2019.
- 1.3.2 A subsequent meeting was held to discuss the draft and Truro Cycling Campaigns representations on 20 March 2019 and this version of the SoCG presents the position of parties following this meeting.

2 Consultation

2.1 Role of Truro Cycling Campaign

2.1.1 Truro Cycling Campaign is a voluntary organisation based in Truro, Cornwall. Its members campaign for improved cycling infrastructure and facilities in the Truro area, promote cycling as a mode of transport, and represent the views and interests of cyclists.

Status in relation to the application

- 2.1.2 As set out in the **Consultation Report** (Document Reference 5.1)[APP-029], Truro Cycling Campaign was consulted during the statutory pre-application consultation under section 47 of the Planning Act 2008, which requires that the applicant consults people who live and work in the vicinity of the proposed development.
- 2.1.3 Specifically, Truro Cycling Campaign was identified by Highways England as an 'additional organisation' in accordance with the Department for Communities and Local Government (DCLG, now Ministry of Housing, Communities and Local Government) guidance² that may be able to make an important contribution in developing the application because of their area of interest and the scheme's interaction with cycling routes. Accordingly, Truro Cycling Campaign was specifically notified of the statutory consultation in addition to the engagement set out in table 2-1.
- 2.1.4 Truro Cycling Campaign did submit a response to the statutory consultation and have subsequently registered with the Planning Inspectorate as an Interested Party in the scheme's Examination.
- 2.1.5 This SoCG has been shared for comment with Sarah Wetherill of the Truro Cycling Campaign.

2.2 Summary of consultation

- 2.2.1 Highways England has been in consultation with Truro Cycling Campaign since December 2017. The parties have continued communicating throughout the progression of the project.
- 2.2.2 A number of consultations are captured within **Table 2-1**, comprised of meetings and emails.
- 2.2.3 The consultation with Truro Cycling Campaign is set out below.

Truro Cycling Campaign and Highways England agree that the provision of the cycle bridge through Designated Funds alongside the provision of the underpass through the scheme will provide a beneficial impact at Chiverton Cross in relation to the ability of users to safely cross the A30. This will in turn allow multi-destination movements across the junction, provide a safe crossing for cyclists along the desire line between St Agnes and Truro and meet policy requirements. 5 Matters outstanding

5.1 Principal matters outstanding

- 5.1.1 The principal matter of disagreement between Truro Cycling Campaign and Highways England related to the absence of a cycle bridge at Chiverton Cross as part of the main scheme / DCO submission. Following further engagement between Truro Cycling Campaign and Highways England, the Campaign have received commitment from Highways England that this project is to be funded through the separate Designated Funds process.
- 5.1.2 This commitment together with flexibility regarding Cornwall Council's match funding means that a designated cycle bridge would be constructed to the optimum design at Chiverton Cross, providing a safe cycle link between St Agnes and Truro on the desire line and in-line with Truro Cycling Campaign's objectives. This would be delivered in addition to the proposed underpass at the new Chiverton Cross junction which is included within the DCO submission.

5.2 Specific matters outstanding

5.2.1 Following recent engagement between Truro Cycling Campaign and Highways England, the commitment by Highways England in relation to the Chiverton Cross Cycle Bridge through Designated Funds, and satisfactory confirmation from Cornwall Council regarding their match funding there are no longer any specific matters outstanding.

Dear Truro Cycling Campaign,

A30 Designated Funds - Chiverton Cross Cycle Bridge

I would like to express our full commitment as Highways England to deliver the Chiverton Cross Cycle Bridge utilising a ground-breaking investment of £17m from the Cycle, Safety and Integration Designated Fund.

As you know, on 20 February 2019 we publicly announced that Highways England have secured £17m to design and deliver four cycle enhancements across central Cornwall. One of these projects is to design and deliver a route from St Agnes to Threemilestone incorporating the Chiverton Cross Cycle Bridge.

The £17m will be provided to Cornwall Council who are contributing an additional £2m and will be the accountable body; responsible for design and delivery.

We have issued Cornwall Council a funding letter setting out the total amount secured, Cornwall Council's role and contribution of £2m, and highlighting that we intend to enter into a funding agreement to enable the transfer of funds.

The funding agreement has been written, reviewed by both parties and is going through the final review process before both parties sign it off. This we anticipate completing in early April.

As Chiverton Cross Cycle bridge is the only section that crosses the Strategic Road Network it will be taken forward as a priority. This is acknowledged by the fact that Cornwall Council are pushing forward a pre-application planning submission. The £17m funding from Highways England will need to be spent by March 2021 due to the funding programme. Cornwall Council's contribution of £2m does not have time restrictions and can be used to deliver Chiverton Cross Cycle bridge.

Cornwall Council have already mobilised, currently working on the design and in discussions with landowners. We are working closely with them to ensure the best

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possible provisions are delivered and we look forward to having the campaign feed into the design.

A30 Designated Funds - St Agnes trail

As you are aware Cornwall Council has committed in principle an additional £2million contribution to support the Highways England £17.1m funding for the Cycling, Safety and Integration (CSI) programme of new high quality cycle routes for Central Cornwall.

Cornwall Council is leading on the delivery of these schemes and is currently reviewing the previous feasibility work undertaken by Highways England Arup team, and undertaking some early community engagement which you have very helpfully supported us with. This work will refine the scheme designs for more formal consultation later in the year in advance of Planning, and feed into a cost and programme review as we move forward.

There is a lot of work for us to do on developing the schemes, acquiring land and getting the necessary Planning and statutory approvals in place, but please be assured we are committed to delivering a high quality off road cycle route from St Agnes to Truro that will include an appropriate crossing of the A30.

The current plan includes a pedestrian/ cycle bridge at Chiverton and we are progressing design options that could provide suitable crossing over either the existing A30 or with the new dual carriageway scheme currently going through the Development Consent Order (DCO) process.

Regardless of the outcome of the DCO we remain committed to providing a route that will meet with our shared objectives for a St Agnes trail and look forward to working with you and colleagues at Truro Cycling campaign to this end.

Cornwall Council's funding contribution to these projects has no specific end date and if circumstances dictate, then our position is that suitable provision could be made from the Council contribution to deliver the optimum cycle/ pedestrian bridge solution alongside the new dual carriageway scheme after the March 2021 HE Designated funding window closes.
