




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1 Introduction

1.1 Purpose of this document

- 1.1.1 This Statement of Common Ground ("SoCG") has been prepared in respect of the application ("the Application") for the proposed M25 junction 28 improvement scheme ("the Scheme") made by Highways England Company Limited ("Highways England") to the Secretary of State for Transport ("Secretary of State") for a Development Consent Order ("the Order") under section 37 of the Planning Act 2008 ("PA 2008").
- 1.1.1 This SoCG does not seek to replicate information which is available elsewhere within the Application documents. All Application documents are available on the Planning Inspectorate website.
- 1.1.2 The SoCG has been produced to confirm to the Examining Authority where agreement has been reached between the parties to it, and where agreement has not (yet) been reached. SoCGs are an established means in the planning process of allowing all parties to identify and so focus on specific issues that may need to be addressed during the examination.

1.2 Parties to this Statement of Common Ground

- 1.2.1 This SoCG has been prepared by (1) Highways England as the Applicant and (2) Department for Environment, Food and Rural Affairs (DEFRA). DEFRA hold land on behalf of the Forestry Commission.
- 1.2.2 Highways England became the Government-owned Strategic Highways Company on 1 April 2015. It is the highway authority in England for the strategic road network and has the necessary powers and duties to operate, manage, maintain and enhance the network. Regulatory powers remain with the Secretary of State. The legislation establishing Highways England made provision for all legal rights and obligations, including in respect of the Application, to be conferred upon or assumed by Highways England.
- 1.2.3 DEFRA is a Government Body and has interests in Plots 4/5, 4/6 and 4/7 on the submitted Land Plans.



1.3 Terminology

- 1.3.1 In the table in the Issues section of this SoCG:
 - "Agreed" indicates area(s) of agreement
 - "Under discussion" indicates area(s) of current disagreement where
 resolution remains possible, and where parties continue discussing the
 issue to determine whether they can reach agreement by the end of the
 examination
 - "Not agreed" indicates a final position for area(s) of disagreement where the resolution of divergent positions will not be possible, and parties agree on this point.
- 1.3.2 It can be assumed that any matters not specifically referred to in the Issues section of this SoCG are not of material interest or relevance to DEFRA and therefore have not been the subject of any discussions between the parties. As such, those matters can be read as agreed, only to the extent that they are either not of material interest or relevance to DEFRA.





2 Record of engagement

2.1.1 A summary of the meetings and correspondence that has taken place between Highways England and DEFRA in relation to the Application is outlined in Table 2-1.

2.1.2 It is agreed that this is an accurate record of the key meetings and other forms of consultation and engagement undertaken between (1) Highways England and (2) DEFRA in relation to the issues addressed in this SoCG.

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3 Issues

3.1 Introduction and general matters

- 3.1.1 This chapter sets out the 'issues' which are agreed, not agreed, or are under discussion between Network Rail and Highways England. On 12 November 2020, the Examining Authority issued a letter under Section 88 of the Planning Act 2008 and Rules 4, 6 and 9 of The Infrastructure Planning (Examination Procedure) Rules 2010 (known as the 'Rule 6 Letter'). Annex D sets out a request for Statements of Common Ground (SoCG) between Highways England and various parties, including with DEFRA. For the DEFRA, the 'Rule 6 Letter' advises that the following issues should be in the SoCG:
 - Crown Land Consent.
