## **Question 3.7.1: Applicant and Historic England**

In your most recent Statement of Common Ground [REP5-005] there are a number of matters listed as being 'Under discussion'. However, it would appear that most of these matters would rely on details being submitted at a later stage should the DCO be made, for example through detailed design. Therefore please review the use of the phrase 'under discussion' in the final SoCG so that wherever possible all matters





are either listed as being 'agreed' or not agreed', even if any such agreement would be subject to further consultations and final agreement at the detailed design stage.

## **Historic England response:**

Historic England participated in a teleconference meeting with Atkins on behalf of Highways England on 15 April 2020 to discuss the matters under discussion in the Statement of Common Ground. We are working with Atkins to replacethe phrase 'under discussion' with either 'agreed' or 'not agreed'.
