# L.1 Introduction

Statutory pre-application consultation between 10 October 2018 and 20 December 2018

Planning Act 2008 Section 46: Duty to notify the Secretary of State of a proposed application

We are writing to provide notification, under Section 46 of the Planning Act 2008, of Highways England's intention to begin statutory pre-application consultation for its proposed Lower Thames Crossing scheme, prior to making an application for a development consent order. The consultation will begin on 10 October 2018 and end on 20 December 2018.

The planned Lower Thames Crossing is a new road with a tunnel crossing beneath the River Thames, between Kent, Thurrock and Essex. It will create a new link between the A2 and the M25 and reduce the burden on the busy A282 Dartford Crossing. The planned route will run from the M25 near North Ockendon, cross the A13 at Orsett before crossing under the River Thames east of Tilbury and Gravesend. A new link road will then take traffic to the A2 near Shorne, close to where the route becomes the M2.

We enclose with this correspondence a USB storage device containing the material we have produced for consultation, as well as examples of the letters that have been sent to our "Section 42" consultees. In January 2020 we wrote to inform the Planning Inspectorate that Highways England was about to launch a non-statutory supplementary consultation on a set of updates to our plans for the Lower Thames Crossing - a new road scheme that would connect Kent with Thurrock and Essex via a tunnel beneath the River Thames.

We are now preparing to launch a further non-statutory design refinement consultation on our proposed design refinements, before submitting an application for Development Consent to the Secretary of State.

The consultation will run from 14 July 2020 until 23:59 on 12 August 2020 and the consultation materials will be made available online at www.lowerthamescrossing.co.uk/design-consultation.

In addition to this letter, we have today provided you with a secure weblink to electronic copies of the material we have produced for consultation, as well as examples of the letters that have been sent to our statutory consultees and identified land interests. With the exception of these letters, all of the material provided in the link will be available on our consultation website (www.lowerthamescrossing.co.uk/design-consultation).

Given the constraints imposed by the COVID-19 pandemic, we will carry out the consultation with an emphasis on digital engagement, whilst taking care to ensure that everyone has the opportunity to view, understand and provide feedback on the proposed refinements.

In order to raise awareness of the consultation in local communities, we will be issuing a leaflet to each address within approximately 2km of the proposed route two weeks in advance of the consultation launch. # Lower Thames Crossing: Local Refinement Consultation between 12 May and 20 June 2022

I am writing to inform you that National Highways will shortly launch the latest phase of nonstatutory consultation on our proposals for the Lower Thames Crossing, which is a new road project that would connect Kent with Thurrock and Essex via a tunnel beneath the River Thames. That consultation – the Local Refinement Consultation – will begin on 12 May and end after a period of over five weeks on 20 June 2022.

Our consultation proposals include changes to our plans for new open space sites and public parks in the vicinity of the proposed new road, including changes to help facilitate the planned Thames Freeport. They also involve a revised connection between the Orsett Cock roundabout and the A1089, improvements to the provision of facilities for walkers, cyclists and horse riders, as well as changes to our landscaping proposals and to our plans affecting local utilities. They also include additional environmental compensation habitat.

In addition to this letter, we have today provided you with electronic copies of the material that we have produced for consultation, as well as examples of the letters that have been sent to our statutory consultees and to identified land interests.
