1 Introduction

1.1 Purpose of the Statement of Common Ground

- 1.1.1 This Statement of Common Ground (SoCG) has been prepared in respect of the Development Consent Order (DCO) application for the proposed A122 Lower Thames Crossing (the Project) made by National Highways Limited (National Highways) to the Secretary of State for Transport (Secretary of State) under section 37 of the Planning Act 2008 on 31 October 2022.
- 1.1.2 The SoCG has been produced to confirm to the Examining Authority where agreement has been reached between National Highways (the Applicant) and Cellnex UK Limited, and where agreement has not been reached. Where, matters are yet to be agreed, the parties will continue to work proactively to reach agreement and will update the SoCG to reflect areas of further agreement.
- 1.1.3 This version of the SoCG has been submitted at Examination Deadline 1.

1.2 Principal Areas of Disagreement

- 1.2.1 On the 19 December 2022 the Examination Authority made some early procedural decisions to assist the Applicant, potential Interested Parties, and themselves to prepare for the Examination of the DCO application.
- 1.2.2 One of these procedural decisions was to use a tracker recording Principal Areas of Disagreement in Summary (PADS) should be used.
- 1.2.3 The PADS Tracker would provide a record of those principal matters of disagreement emerging from the SoCG and should be updated alongside the SoCG as appropriate throughout the examination with the expectation that a revised PADS Tracker should be submitted at every Examination deadline.
- 1.2.4 Cellnex UK Limited elected not to produce a PADS Tracker at pre-examination stage, indicating to the Applicant that they did not have any principal areas of disagreement and were content that Table 2.1 within this SoCG adequately presented their matters.

1.3 Terminology

1.3.1 In the matters table in section 2 of this SoCG, "Matter not agreed" indicates agreement on the matter could not be reached following significant engagement, and "Matter under discussion" where these points will be the subject of ongoing discussion wherever possible to resolve, or refine, the extent of disagreement between the parties. "Matter Agreed in Principle" indicates where the parties have identified and agreed on a resolution method to be applied in the future.

It is the highway authority in England for the strategic road network and has the necessary powers and duties to operate, manage, maintain and enhance the network. Regulatory powers remain with the Secretary of State. The legislation establishing National Highways made provision for all legal rights and obligations of the Highways Agency, including in respect of the Project, to be conferred upon or assumed by National Highways.¶

Cellnex Group is a significant pan-European tower operator with sites in the UK, Ireland, Spain, Portugal, Sweden, Denmark, Austria, Poland, Italy, France, Switzerland and the Netherlands. It has 131,000 communication sites, 71,000 of them already in the portfolio and the rest in the process of closing or planned roll-outs up to 2030 and positions the company to develop new generation networks. ¶

Cellnex UK Limited is the largest supplier of sites available for sharing by other operators, for example, the Mobile Network Operators (MNOs), Airwave and other emergency/breakdown service network operators, the Royal National Lifeboat Institution (RNLI), the Coastguard and Maritime Services, Mountain Rescue and a range of central and local government departments and agencies. It operates around 9,000 active shared wireless infrastructure sites (neutral host) utilised by all the MNOs for the deployment of existing and future generations of mobile connectivity and particularly 5G. Additionally, Cellnex UK has access to other tall buildings and structures not yet developed for electronic communications

use.¶
Cellnex UK Limited is the owner of telecommunication towers and ancillary equipment in the Ockendon and Gravesend areas. ¶

National Highways currently anticipates that only one site will be within the boundary of the Development. That site is located on land at Inn On The Lake Hotel, Shorne, Gravesend and is often referred to as 'Inn on the Lake' (Cellnex Site Reference 1490517). However, Cellnex UK have further interests outside of the Order Limit boundary which may be affected by the Project specifically in connection to line of sight issues. These matters and

2 Matters

2.1 Movement of outstanding matters

- 2.1.1 Following submission of the previous version of this Draft SoCG between the Applicant and Cellnex UK Limited, further discussions on the outstanding matters have taken place.
- 2.1.2 _Table 2.1 details and presents, the matters which have been agreed, not agreed, or are under discussion between (1) the Applicant and (2) Cellnex UK | imited.
- 2.1.3 In the column 'Item No' in Table 2.1, 'Rule 6' indicates a matter entered in the SoCG as a result of a request in the Rule 6 letter, 'RRN' indicates a matter entered into the SoCG as a result of content in the Relevant Representation, 'RRE' indicates an existing SoCG matter that was also raised in the Relevant Representation and 'DLX' indicates a new matter added during examination at/around that deadline.
- 2.1.4 In Table 2.1, relevant issues relating to the dDCO articles, and Requirements in Schedule 2 to the dDCO have been identified under the heading 'DCO and Consents',
- 2.1.5 At Examination Deadline 1, there are nine matters in total of which seven are agreed and two under discussion.
- 2.1.6 The two matters which remain under discussion will not change until the detailed design stage (post examination).
- 2.1.7 Discussions with Cellnex UK Limited will progress at the detailed design phase when the Applicant expects these matters to be agreed. The Applicant considers that these matters will be resolved outside the DCO process once it is closer to carrying out works. In any event, the Applicant considers that the protective provisions already agreed between the parties provide adequate protection to Cellnex's interests.
- 2.1.8 If no new matters emerge during the Examination phase, then this SoCG will become the 'Final SoCG' by Deadline 9.
