# Application by National Highways for an Order Granting Development Consent for the **Lower Thames Crossing**

# Accompanied Site Inspection itineraries – 12, 13 & 14 September 2023

The itineraries for the accompanied site inspections (ASIs) to be held by the Examining Authority (ExA) on 12, 13 & 14 September 2023 (the September ASIs) can be found below:

- 12 September 2023 Annex A;
- 13 September 2023 Annex B; and
- 14 September 2023 Annex C.

The itineraries have been constructed having regard to submissions at the Preliminary Meeting and Procedural deadline C, the Applicant's draft itinerary submitted at Deadline 1 [REP1-178] and to comments on that document submitted at Deadline 2.

These itineraries do not address all of the ASI requests that have been made. The Examination Timetable provides for additional ASIs to be held in October and November if required and it is anticipated that further itineraries will be prepared. The ExA will also continue to make unaccompanied site inspections (USIs) to sites where it can gain access and appreciate relevant matters without accompaniment, consent or assistance.

ASIs provide an opportunity for the ExA to look at the condition of and physical features that can be seen on or from the inspected sites with the permission or assistance of the participants. Participants may be invited by the ExA to point out specific features of interest.

The ASIs are **not** an opportunity to provide oral representations on the project or to submit or discuss evidence. This is because, unlike hearings, ASI proceedings are not recorded and published. If you want to make oral representations or provide evidence on the matters to be observed on a particular site, please ask to attend Open Floor Hearing 4 (OFH4) on the evening of 6 September 2023 as detailed in the Hearing Notification. Alternatively, you

may make observations in writing at Deadline 3, directing the ExA's attention to matters observed on specific sites during the ASIs.

## Joining the ASIs

The ASIs will start and end at the locations and as close as possible to the times shown in each Annex. There will be opportunities for participants to join and leave from identified staging points along the routes. If you do join at a staging point, opportunities for transport back to that staging point are limited to those identified in the itineraries. It will be your responsibility to speak to the driver(s) if you do wish to take up such an opportunity. In order to keep the inspections to route and time, transport from or to locations other than the identified start, end or staging points cannot be provided.

Participants are asked to assemble promptly and in good time at the start or their chosen staging point. These locations can be found using the links in the annexed tables and maps to Google Maps and, most precisely, to What 3 Words<sup>1</sup>. The ASI will not wait for people who have asked to attend but who are not at the right location at the appointed time. To ensure that the ExA can inspect all of the locations that it has asked to inspect and in fairness to other participants who have arrived on time, we cannot wait for people who have not done so. However, if the ASI is a few minutes late arriving at a staging point, please do bear with us. We will endeavour to keep to time but may not always be able to do so due to conditions beyond our control.

To ensure the smooth running of the ASIs, attendees may wish to provide contact details for the day, to notify the Case Team if there are any changes in attendance and ensure the Planning Inspectorate is made aware of any special access requirements at least one week in advance of the events.

or by phoning Customer Services on 0303 444 5000 by **4 September 2023**. Please advise which days you wish to attend. If you want to join or leave an ASI at a staging point, then please identify which one(s) you would like to use.

#### **Transport**

The Applicant will provide transport between the ASI locations and within some larger sites. Participants are asked to follow the reasonable health and safety requirements and requests made by the drivers of vehicles used for transport purposes and always to wear seatbelts when vehicles are in motion. Please contact the Case Team by 4 September 2023 if you have any questions about access to or safety on board this transport.

Whilst timings are provided in the itineraries, please be aware that the drivers have to respond to traffic conditions on the day and so travel times may sometimes vary from those shown.

Please also note that some parts of the ASIs will require the use of specialist vehicles with limited seating capacity. We will try to accommodate all people who have registered to attend, but it is important that you do not attend with additional people who have not registered.

#### Clothing and protective equipment

The ASIs will proceed at the notified date and time unless severe weather or other significantly adverse conditions make it unsafe or inappropriate to do so. Because of the need to keep ASIs to time within an Examination timetable, decisions to cancel or to amend them are not taken lightly. Significant elements of the ASIs will be held on foot and in locations where it will be necessary to use Public Rights of Way (PRoWs) that cross open land and are unsurfaced. Some parts of the ASIs may access land where there is no formed track or path and there may be some measure of difficulty with access due to ground conditions or vegetation. Please check the weather forecast before you attend and dress to respond to forecast conditions which may include heat, cold, rainfall and high wind. Attendees are recommended to wear sturdy water-proof footwear and to bring weather-appropriate clothing including sun, wind, and rain protection. The Applicant will provide any specialist personal protective equipment (PPE) such as hard hats, high visibility jackets, safety glasses and gloves, if required. There will be visits to operating roads, where high visibility jackets provided by the Applicant are recommended to be worn.

# Sites on private land

Access onto private land is subject to the granting of appropriate permission by the person controlling the land. Householders and businesses, occupiers and landowners may reasonably refuse to allow some persons accompanying the ASI onto their land. Other legal or operational requirements may apply that limit attendance. Under such circumstances, the ExA will decide whether or not to proceed with that part of the inspection and may ask those not able to be granted access to leave at a prior staging point or to wait outside. Where access to a site is limited, the ExA will always endeavour to ensure that it is accompanied by at least one independent person in addition to the owner/ occupier of the land and a representative of the Applicant, to ensure that the inspection is conducted fairly and transparently. The ExA will normally ask for an officer of the relevant local planning authority (LPA) to undertake the role of independent person if they are present.

#### Refreshments and comfort

The itineraries provide time for comfort breaks. They identify locations where to the best of our knowledge refreshments can be purchased and where there will be access to toilet facilities. Refreshments will not be provided. Please bring your own refreshments or a means of purchasing them. Out of consideration for attendees with allergies, we have been asked to pass on a request to avoid bringing food containing peanuts. It will be important to carry your own drinking water, especially if you plan to remain with an ASI for a full day.

The vehicles used for transport may be used to collect or drop off attendees at other staging points during scheduled comfort breaks. Please do not leave unattended belongings on a vehicle during these breaks.

#### **Cancellations and amendments**

Please note that in the unlikely event that an ASI needs to be cancelled or amended, we will endeavour to contact attendees beforehand. However, because such changes may relate to unpredictable events occurring in real time, it may not be possible to communicate a cancellation or amendment decision before all parties set off for the start or for a staging point. In circumstances such as very poor weather or unforeseen traffic delays, information about the ASIs will be posted on the Planning Inspectorate's National Infrastructure Planning website landing page for the Lower Thames Crossing which can be viewed here:

Please check the website regularly on the day of the ASI to ensure that you receive the most up to date information about the start and progress of the Inspections. Consider bringing a smart phone with you if you have one. If no updates are posted on the website, then you can assume that the ASI is proceeding broadly to its itinerary.


