Responses of the Kent Downs AONB Unit to Procedural Deadline 9a

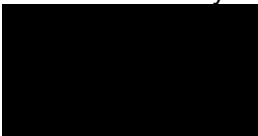
Please find attached the Kent Downs AONB Unit's response to Deadline 9a of the Lower Thames Crossing Examination.
