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1 Introduction

1.1 Purpose of this document

- 1.1.1 On 31 October 2022, National Highways (the Applicant) submitted an Application under section 37 of the Planning Act 2008 for an order to grant development consent for the A122 Lower Thames Crossing (the Project). On 28 November 2022 the Planning Inspectorate accepted the Application for Detailed Examination
- 1.1.2 A Statement of Commonality was submitted with the Application to assist the Examining Authority (ExA) in understanding areas of commonality across the Statements of Common Ground (SoCGs) which have been prepared between the Applicant and a range of parties.
- 1.1.3 The Applicant notes that procedural decision PD-013-17 within the Rule 6 Letter [PD-013] identifies nine documents which should be submitted at each Examination Deadline or included as a 'nil return'.
- 1.1.4 The Statement of Commonality was identified as one of these documents and as such, it has been submitted at each Examination Deadline.
- 1.1.5 The document comprises the Applicant's understanding of the <u>final</u> stakeholders' positions, as set out in the SoCGs submitted by the Applicant to the ExA at Examination Deadline 9A.
- 1.1.6 For more detailed information on the respective stakeholders' positions, in relation to the topics covered in this Statement of Commonality, please refer to the individual SoCGs.

1.2 Structure of this document

- 1.2.1 This document comprises four chapters as described below:
 - a. Chapter 1 (this chapter) sets out the purpose and structure of the document.
 - Chapter 2 provides an introduction to the drafting of the SoCGs along with a summary of their structure.
 - c. Chapter 3 provides an up-to-date list of the SoCGs and their status.
 - d. Chapter 4 provides a summary table (matrix) which indicates areas of commonality across headings within the SoCGs and presents some highlevel commentary.

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2 Statements of Common Ground

- 2.1.1 The Applicant has sought SoCGs with a number and range of parties in order to capture their respective positions on material matters relating to the Application.
- 2.1.2 The Applicant has submitted a SoCG with 74 Interested Parties however, Swale Borough Council withdrew from the SoCG process prior to Deadline 9A (notifying the Planning Inspectorate accordingly).
- 2.1.3 Of the remaining 73 SoCGs this document deals with 65, the eight SoCGs not included are those with individual landowners because the matters contained within those are particular to the landowner.
- 2.1.4 A full list of the 65 SoCGs and their status is provided in Chapter 3 where:
 - a. Table 3.1 lists SoCGs submitted with the Application on 31 October 2022.
 - Table 3.2 lists new SoCGs prepared with parties in response to the Rule 6 Letter [PD-013].
 - c. Table 3.3 lists additional SoCGs submitted at Deadline 1 with further parties that were not submitted with the Application, or requested in the Rule 6 Letter [PD-013], but which the Applicant felt would assist the Examining Authority.
 - Table 3.4 lists new SoCGs with further parties that were submitted at Deadline 2.
 - e. Table 3.5, lists new SoCGs with further parties that were submitted at Deadline 6.
- 2.1.5 To ensure consistency across the SoCGs, a uniform approach has been taken to drafting the SoCGs. Each is generally structured as follows:
 - a. A clear indication of the status of the SoCG.
 - An introduction, setting out the purpose of the document, an overview of the key terminology, and a summary of the movement of Matters where the SoCG is an updated version.
 - A table setting out the characterisation of the positions of the Applicant and
 of the parties on each Matter, and the status of agreement of the Matter.
 Across the SoCGs this table is structured by a common list of topics.
 - d. A summary of engagement undertaken, and information shared in order to draft the position and reach an agreed status of Matters within the SoCG.
 - e. Where applicable, appendices providing additional information relating to the documents considered within the SoCG, and information on the engagement undertaken.

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2.1.6 A uniform approach has been taken across the suite of SoCGs to documenting the position on each matter.

3 List and status

- 3.1.1 This Chapter of the document provides a list of the SoCGs and a summary of the final status of each.
- 3.1.2 In accordance with the examination timetable (in the Rule 8(3) and 9 letter [PD-049]), at Examination Deadline 9A, SoCGs are to be submitted as final iterations.
- 3.1.3 The final status of each can be summarised by one of the following:
 - a. **Final Agreed SoCG** a final version of the SoCG that has been signed by both parties or endorsed by email.

Final SoCG – a final version of the SoCG, that the Applicant considers is an accurate description based on the engagement that has taken place but is not signed or endorsed.

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Agreed Draft – a draft SoCG with matters outstandir which has been endorsed by the Interested Party via email to confirm it

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4 Commonality

4.1 Summary

- 4.1.1 This Chapter of the document provides a summary of the material matters covered in each SoCG and demonstrates where there is commonality in the matters being discussed with parties.
- 4.1.2 Table 4.2 shows (a) the headings covered by the SoCGs running along the top, and (b) the parties running down the side.
- 4.1.3 Within the matrix in the table, the colour coding represents (a) whether matters under the headings are broadly agreed, under discussion, or not agreed, or (b) whether the heading has not been a material matter in engagement. This is represented by colour coding as set out in Table 4.1.

- 4.1.4 Table 4.2 has had a primary purpose to assist the Examining Authority in understanding the headings which were, under discussion or not agreed, particularly such headings where the position was, shared across more than one Interested Party, the categorisation and colour coding in the matrix is intended to represent the broad position per heading (it is not absolute).
- 4.1.5 At Examination Deadline 9A, where a party has raised multiple matters under the same heading, the colour coding has been assigned to the status with >51%. Where there was an equal split, the 'broadly not agreed' status has been used.
- 4.1.6

 It should also be noted that where colour coding in Table 4.2 shows some headings as 'broadly not agreed', the number of matters agreed with that Interested Party for that heading could in fact be greater in number than with other Interested Parties where the same heading is designated as 'broadly agreed'. For a more detailed view of the status of matters, see the individual SoCGs.
- 4.1.7 At Examination Deadline 9A, as all* SoCGs are final, Table 4.2 now presents the final positions reached with the Interested Parties, in accordance with the interpretation to be employed as set out in 4.1.3 to 4.1.5.

*The Port of Tilbury London Limited SoCG has not been submitted at Deadline 9A and so the positions presented in Table 4.2 represent the latest draft SoCG being discussed between the parties as of 14 December 2024. The Final SoCG will be submitted at Deadline 10.

10 Three 'Population and human health' matters agreed, one not agreed. ¶

4.2 Commentary at Examination Deadline <u>9A</u>

- 4.2.1 The top 10 headings where matters are either all or broadly all agreed are:
 - a. Cumulative effects matters raised by two parties, 100% of matters agreed.
 - Marine Biodiversity matters raised by four parties, <u>100</u>% of matters agreed.
 - c. Road Drainage and the Water matters raised by 11 parties, 91% of matters agreed.
 - d. Cultural Heritage matters raised by nine parties, 89% of matters agreed.
 - e. **Material Assets and Waste** matters raised by seven parties, <u>86</u>% of matters agreed.
 - a. <u>Protective Provisions</u>, matters raised by <u>22</u> parties, <u>77</u>% of matters agreed.
 - b. Geological and Soils matters raised by four parties, 75% of matters agreed and Need for the Project matters raised by 20 parties, 75% of matters agreed.
 - c. DCO and Consents matters raised by 34 parties, 74% of matters agreed,
 - d. Protective Provisions matters raised by <u>22, parties, 77,% of matters</u> agreed.
 - e. Consultation and Engagement matters raised by 22 parties, 73% of matters agreed
- 4.2.2 The top <u>10</u>, headings where matters are **broadly not agreed** are:
 - a. Wider Network Impacts matters raised by 23 parties, with 87% of matters not agreed.
 - <u>Jraffic and Economics</u> matters raised by 25 parties, <u>84% of matters are</u> not agreed.
 - c. Climate matters raised by six parties, 83% of matters are not agreed.
 - d. **Socio Economics** matters raised by six parties, 83%, of matters are not agreed.
 - e. **EIA Methodology** matters raised by seven parties, 71% of matters are not agreed.
 - f. Noise and Vibration matters raised by 10 parties, 60% of matters are not agreed.

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Deleted: Table 4.2 shows that there are a large number of topics which are not of particular interest to some parties. This reflects the reality that different parties have different technical and professional interests, and/or particular spatial and local interests, which inevitably focuses interest toward particular topics:¶

The Statutory Environmental Bodies are particularly focused on environmental topics, and less focused on Design, Operation and Maintenance, and Traffic and Economics matters.

The Business and Industry cohort is focused on a small number of issues.¶

For the Statutory Undertakers, Utility Owners and Regulators, common ground has been sought across DCO and Consents, Design (roads, tunnels, utilities), Construction, Operations and Maintenance, and Protective

Construction, Operations and Maintenance, and Protecti Provisions – most other topics have not been raised by these stakeholders.¶

Across the Local Authorities and Transport Bodies cohort, and Community and Parish Councils cohort, common ground has been sought across the breadth of topics.¶
