Thank you for consulting Derbyshire County Council on the Rule 6 Letter for the A57 Link Roads Development Consent Order (DCO) Examination. Derbyshire County Council's response to the three requests for submissions included in the Rule 6 letter are as follows:

## Written submissions about how the application should be examined

Derbyshire County Council has no concerns or issues to raise regarding how the application should be examined. Derbyshire County Council's officers were extensively engaged with the recent DCO examination into the A38 Derby Junctions Improvement Scheme between November 2019 and July 2020. The examination was conducted through face-to-face meetings early on during the examination and then, due to the onset of the Covid-19 pandemic, the remaining part of the examination was conducted through a series of virtual hearing meetings. In Derbyshire County Council's experience, the virtual hearings worked very well and were efficiently organised by the Planning Inspectorate's Case Team; were clear in terms of their technical details and requirements for joining hearings and code of conduct at the hearings; and the Panel of Inspectors conducted the hearings in a very fair and efficient manner, so that no parties appeared to be disadvantaged by holding the sessions in a virtual means compared to face-to-face hearings. Derbyshire County Council's only detailed observation is that each individual section of the virtual hearing sessions should not be too lengthy i.e. each individual topic session should last no more than 2 hours without a short break in between.
