Highways England Company Limited of Bridge House, 1 Walnut Tree Close, Guildford, GU1 4EZ proposes to dual the A47 between North Tuddenham and Easton. We intend to make an application to the Secretary of State under section 37 of The Planning Act 2008 for a development consent order to authorise our building and operating the scheme.

Before making our application, we must produce a document called the Statement of Community Consultation (SCCC) setting out how we will consult the local community about our proposals. We also must make this statement available for inspection by the public and publish this notice stating where and when the statement can be inspected. We then must carry out consultation in accordance with the SCCC.

The scheme's main proposals in summary are:

- to build a new dual carriageway that will not directly lie on the current A47 road between North Tuddenham and Easton
- to build two new junctions - one at the Wood Lane and Berry's Lane junction and the other at the Tavernham Road and Blind Lane junction
- to retain the existing A47 between North Tuddenham and Easton for local traffic where possible

## Rapper who became one of Europe's most wanted Isis militants arrested in Spain

Spanish police have arrested a rapper turned Islamic State extremist, Abdel-Majed Abdel Bary, one of the most wanted militants in Europe, in a counter-terrorism swoop.

British and other sources yesterday confirmed his identity a few hours after the national police agency in Madrid said it had arrested an Egyptian national, along with two other men in the southern city of Almeria.

Originally from Maida Vale in London, Abdel Bary was a joint British-Egyptian national, whose UK citizenship was stripped because

of his links to the terror group. Once considered a notorious Isis figure, he had disappeared from view in recent years.

One source said he had been arrested in Spain shortly after entering the country from Algeria, but this could not immediately be confirmed.

The son of Adel Abdel Bary, who was convicted of the US embassy bombings in Kenya and Tanzania, which killed 213 people, the 29-year-old had been a vocal supporter of Isis during the two years he had been publicly with the group from 2013 to 2015. In that time he had posed with a severed head, and frequently threatened the west on social media.

There was speculation at the time that he could have been the hooded

jihadi, nicknamed Jihadi John, who beheaded a number of western hostages on camera.

However, that terrorist was later revealed to be Mohammed Emwazi - a figure whom Abdel Bary had known through west London Islamic circles, along with four other men, branded by their captors as the Beatles.

He disappeared in the intervening years, leading to speculation he had been killed as the group's so-called caliphate crumbled from late-2015. By then, he is believed to have fled Syria and Iraq for Turkey, when investigators lost track of him.

A video posted by the Spanish national police showed three men being led away from a flat with their faces covered. A police statement describes one of the men as among the most wanted Isis fighters in Europe.

Turkish police, who had been asked by British officials to hunt for Abdel Bary, said they lost track of him by late-2015. There were suspicions that he had used the then highly active migrant route to smuggle himself to central Europe via Greece. Abdel Bary is thought to have had a Spanish girlfriend whom he met online sometime in 2017. By then, he is believed to have resumed an online presence using numerous aliases.

During a brief career as a rapper in London, he was known as Lyricist Jinn and L Jinn, and had performed with a group that called itself the Black Triangle. After immersing himself in his faith, he denounced his former life and friends. He left his family and five siblings for the Isis stronghold of Raqqa in July 2013. The group would soon conquer a swathe of land in Iraq and Syria.

A Home Office official said there was nothing to add to the Spanish statement.

## Robinson accused of attacking girl, 16, says judge

Online comments made by the far-right activist Tommy Robinson about a Syrian teenager amounted to accusations that the young refugee had "participated in a violent assault on a young girl" and "threatened to stab another child", a judge has ruled.

In an interim ruling on a libel case, Mr Justice Nicklin said the "natural and ordinary meaning" of the two Robinson videos, which have been viewed more than 900,000 times, relates to a "specific allegation of violent conduct".

The claim follows an incident in November 2018 when Jamal Hijazi, then 16, was pushed to the ground and threatened with drowning at Almondsbury Community school in Huddersfield. Footage of the refugee student being pushed to the ground and having water poured on his face

was watched millions of times, provoking outrage and public sympathy.

Robinson, 37, whose real name is Stephen Yaxley-Lennon, then posted two videos on Facebook claiming Jamal was "not innocent and he violently attacks young English girls in his school".

A full hearing of the libel case has yet to be scheduled. In his preliminary decision yesterday, the judge ruled the accusations in the videos were that Jamal had, "as part of a gang, participated in a violent assault on a young girl which had caused her significant injuries and threatened to stab another child". Jamal's lawyers say the allegations are "very seriously defamatory". Nicklin, however, rejected

their contention that Robinson's statements would be understood to suggest there were other "incidents of violence beyond the particular acts that were identified" in the videos.

"The viewer would recognise that the defendant was making a specific allegation of violent conduct against the claimant," the judge said.

Nicklin said the ordinary and reasonable viewer of the videos would understand Robinson to have been speaking figuratively when he said Jamal was "not innocent, he attacks young girls". The judge also rejected Robinson's suggested meaning of the statements, that "as part of a gang, the claimant has committed serious acts of violence against a schoolgirl".

Nicklin ruled that Robinson's suggested meaning "fails to capture the gravity of the allegation being made against the claimant, specifically that [the girl] had been beaten 'black and blue' ... and ignores, completely, the allegation of a threat to stab the boy that is made clearly in the first video".

In his ruling, Nicklin stated: "It is important to note that the court is only dealing with the issue of meaning. The defendant has advanced a defence of truth. Unless the parties resolve the litigation, that issue [and others] will be determined at a later trial."

At a previous hearing last November, William Bennett QC, for Robinson, said his defence would focus on "those people who say they were assaulted by the claimant and the claimant's denials that he assaulted them".
