- A47 DUALLING

We are submitting a response to the Public Consultation relating to the dualling of the A47 between North Tuddenham and Easton on behalf of our client

Mr Meynell owns Berry Hall a Grade II listed 18th century hall and approximately 125 acres of parkland, arable land and woodland. The Estate is designated as a National Heritage Asset and is of "outstanding scenic, historic or scientific interest" as deemed by HMRC. As a result must;

"take all reasonable steps for its maintenance and the preservation of its character and for securing reasonable access to the public in pursuance of which they will abide by the terms of the Heritage Management Plan drawn up in January 2002 in conjunction with The Countryside Agency, in so far as this Management Plan applies to the property."

The Estate has been protected as it has remained unchanged for over 100 years and is therefore is an excellent example of this type of historic estate. The public benefit from this with the Estate open to visitors via footpaths all year round and the gardens, park and woodlands are open to the public four days a year. Along with the Hall there are the following historical assets:

- traditional cottages
- a series of traditional agricultural buildings
- a crinkle crankle wall
- a 17th century tithe barn wall
- a Victorian water garden
- a 19th century ice house which is Grade II listed in its own right

Over the course of many years, to protect this, planted shelter belts of trees to protect the Hall and Estate from the current A47. The plans, as currently proposed, site the new Wood Lane junction approximately 250m from Berry Hall itself and destroy the tree shelter belts.

The new junction would also take between 10-15 acres of land (8-12% of the Estate), significantly impacting its integrity and threatening the reasons for its status as a heritage asset.

In addition to the concerns regarding the Estate's historically significance there are other areas of concern;

- Environmental
 - There is a population of bats in the ice house.
 - There are a number of ancient hedges on the Estate including those which are proposed to be removed on Berry's Lane.





- The woodland on the Estate is highly rated and used regularly for visits by the Royal Forestry Society, Woodland Heritage and the Association of Professional Foresters.
- At a time when the government is committing the country to planting billions of trees to ensure we are carbon neutral by 2050 it seems counterproductive to remove a belts of trees shielding a road.
- The Highways Agency has carried out environmental surveys but neither we nor our client has seen these. We request they are sent to us.

Lack of Consultation

- There has been a lack of consultation with both our client and us on this matter and what information has been provided has been lacking detail.
- Changes have been made to the proposed scheme since the first drafts where discussed, but these have not been communicated to either our client nor us.

Funding

- We are aware that significant funding has previously been allocated to this project but in light of the Covid-19 outbreak and as a result the increasing cost of building materials and contractors we question whether this funding will be sufficient.
- Given the way resources are being reallocated by both central and local government to fight Covid-19, will additional funding be available if required?
- The cost of the Norwich Northern Distributer Road ended up significantly higher than was budgeted for. We would like to know what Highways England's contingency plans are for this scenario.

Our client is proposing that the scheme, and junction in particular, be moved approximately 100m to the north on to open farmland, which does not have the same environmental and historical attributes. Therefore this would allow the tree shelter belts to be retained and the impact on this historic Estate be minimised. At this stage there do not appear to be any provisions to replace these trees. Even if trees are replanted it will take over twenty years for them to reach the size and density they are now.

When the line of the new road was first established Highways England did not make provision for the Western Link of the Norwich Northern Distributer Road to connect in to it. This has resulted in the requirement of a much larger junction which encroaches considerably more on to the Estate. As the scheme has had a material change to it we propose the suitability of the route should be reassessed.

As the proposed plans are currently drawn the access from the farm buildings to the north which joins the A47 and the access from the Hall and Hall Cottages to the east which joins Berry's Lane are being severed by new or altered roads. At this stage it is unclear how these access routes will once again join the highway.

Due to the Covid-19 outbreak and Government guidance regarding social distancing and the subsequent national lockdown, our scheduled site meeting with Highways England could not happen. As a result we have not had the opportunity to discuss issues on site and would request that no plans are finalised until a meeting of this nature has happened.

To confirm the call please see the below points:

- Can there be wording added in order to make the condition reports more stringent. "A copy of the pre-entry annotated photographic record of condition survey will be provided to the Licensor before commencement of works to be agreed with the parties. The depth of the topsoil removed will be recorded. The sub- contractor does not take any soil profiles, this is not standard practice however additional photographic evidence will be taken during excavation to assist in ensuring the land is returned to former condition." [Stirzaker, Craig] Happy to agree to the sentiment, however wording has been changed to read 'A schedule of condition will be used to record the ground conditions. This will include photographic record of condition and the depth of topsoil removed. Additional photographic evidence will be taken during excavation where required to assist in ensuring the land to its former condition'.
- As our clients will have to make additional operations outside of the normal harvest time to clear the sites of crops they will incur increased labour and machinery costs. We would like wording added to state that clients' time and additional machinery cost will be covered as part of any claim. [Stirzaker, Craig] We will not agree to putting this into the rider. Our view point is that the crops would ordinarily have been harvested and sold and the cost of labour would have been included in the price of sale. The claims on land where crop losses would be incurred would use the market rate for the crop and as such that would cover the costs associated with farming or clearing. Again, to reiterate, only reasonable evidencable losses incurred over the value of the licence will be covered.
- We once again request that the timeframe for payment following the reinstatement of the trenches is 3-5 days as it is at Blofield. [Stirzaker, Craig] As discussed on the phone on previous calls, we cannot and will not put this into the rider, it is simply setting ourselves up to fail. Blofield may have promised this however we feel that knowing the process company process for payments that this is simply unachievable. The payment term will remain within 14 days.
- We would like to add wording to the paragraph on treasure to ensure that unless otherwise stated in the legislation any discoveries are the landowner's property "Any and all archaeological finds or articles of value discovered whilst carrying out the archaeological trenching works will be the sole property of the Licensor unless subject to the provisions of the Ancient Monuments & Archaeological Areas Act 1979 and the Treasure Act 1996." [Stirzaker, Craig] Accepted and incorporated.

We are submitting a further response to the Public Consultation relating to the dualling of the A47 between North Tuddenham and Easton on behalf of our client Morth Tuddenham. Our previous response was a letter dated 1st April 2020.

The points in this letter are in addition to those made in our previous letter and in response to the recent scheme updates and changes, notably the announcement of the locations of the construction, materials handling and storage compounds.

We believe it is iniquitous that only one month's notice was given for these important matters and that the consultation period was held over Christmas.

Impact on Farming

Currently at Berry Hall there is a mix of arable and livestock farming carried out by a farmer on a contract basis. The current plans propose to take approx. 30 acres of land out of production (80% of all arable land), thus decimating the viability of the Estate to be used in its current manner.

This is likely to mean the end of farming at Berry Hall for the foreseeable future as there will not be enough useful land left on which the farmer can make a meaningful living. The remaining land will also be of such small scale in farming terms that it will not be viable.

If the eastern field is used there will be no way of moving cattle to the low meadows to the east of Berry's Lane.

Given that unviable situation resulting from the land take would last for several years, farmer will have little choice but to leave and may never return. This will potentially alter the farming practices at Berry Hall permanently.

The land to the north of the new road is part of a much larger estate and so while the current impact in terms of acres taken would no doubt be similar, the proportionate impact on the estate and farming business will be much less than at Berry Hall. It would therefore make sense to move as much of the construction and storage sites to the open agricultural land to the north west as possible.

Residential Impact

There are 10 households (9 on the Berry Hall Estate and 1 adjacent) that would be severely impacted by pollution, noise and light as a result of the location of the construction, materials handling and storage





compounds. These households include elderly people and someone suffering from post-traumatic stress disorder (PTSD).

Once again, moving as much as possible to the bare farmland north of the new road would reduce this impact. Not a single household would be affected to the north of the new road as there are none.

Holiday Cottage

The Estate owns a holiday cottage, the business of which will be impacted upon by this scheme. As with the residential properties there will be significantly less impact both from a business point of view as well as a personal one if the compound can be moved to the north.

Impact on Children's Home

Merrywood House is not technically part of the Estate, but it is adjacent and controlled by a Meynell Family Trust. It is a children's home for severely distressed and traumatised children who have been placed there for therapeutic care. The location and rural nature of this facility is a key element in the treatment of the children.

There is a compound proposed to be on Estate land within close proximity of Merrywood House. This disturbance is likely to have a significant and harmful impact on the treatment of the children.

Heritage Impact

We have previously pointed out that the Estate is designated as a National Heritage Asset and is of "outstanding scenic, historic or scientific interest" as deemed by HMRC and as a result Mr Meynell must;

"take all reasonable steps for its maintenance and the preservation of its character and for securing reasonable access to the public in pursuance of which they will abide by the terms of the Heritage Management Plan drawn up in January 2002 in conjunction with The Countryside Agency [now Natural England], in so far as this Management Plan applies to the property."

While the road itself will have a profound and negative impact on this designation, the impact of the compounds is likely to be more severe as for the duration of the works the character of the Estate will be severely impacted as will the public benefit. The construction works could threaten the Heritage Status of the Estate. Once again the impact would be lessened if the compounds could be moved to the north.

General Points

A larger drainage pipe will need to be installed beneath Berry's Lane to allow for the additional water being brought to this location as a result of the proposed drainage changes.

There has been mention that the footpath that runs east-west to the north of Merrywood House may have its surface upgraded to something more a kin to a hard track. We would oppose this as it would encourage cyclists which are not permitted on a footpath. It is a rural footpath and thus should remain grass.

We have requested that Highways England look at the possibility of creating a gated access from the new roundabout on the southern side of the flyover at Berry's Lane to the track that runs north-south from Mr Meynell's agricultural buildings. As it stands Mr Meynell's only access route for HGVs will be cut off permanently, which is not acceptable. The solution we are proposing would be the easiest way around this.

In a meeting with Highways England, when asked about the possibility of the compounds being moved to the north, we were told that the scheme cannot move outside of the red line on the plan. This red line was apparently the first element of the new road scheme to be decided. It seems totally iniquitous that something as vital as

this was decided in advance of any public consultation about these various compounds and before the potential impact of them on local residents was assessed.
