## **Response by Norwich Cycling Campaign**

We refer to 10.0.02;

• What is the function of the spur of former Church Lane to the north of the proposed Easton pedestrian/cycle bridge? Is this necessary?

There is a case for stopping up this spur as it will introduce vehicles to Church Lane and, at the crossroads, allow vehicles to access Ringland Road and Costessey Lane which could produce a "rat run" into the City avoiding the Longwater Interchange (notorious for congestion). It will also reduce the value of the proposed cycle/pedestrian bridge over the A47 at Dog Lane. Ringland Road should be considered as a "quiet lane" allowing access to the valley of the rivers Wensum and Yare for recreational and tourist cycling.
