I am writing to you regarding Highways England's proposed A47 Wansford to Sutton Scheme (the Scheme) which will improve journeys along the A47 to the west of Peterborough.

The Scheme is an upgrade to the existing 1.6 mile section of single carriageway of the A47 between Wansford and Sutton by providing a new dual carriageway and junction improvements. The existing A47 from Wansford to Sutton experiences delays and high levels of congestion during peak hours. Highways England's aim is to improve traffic flow, journey times, route safety and resilience. The scheme aims to support economic growth by making journeys safer and more reliable.

The Scheme is a Nationally Significant Infrastructure Project (NSIP) under the Planning Act 2008 (the 2008 Act). This means we will apply for a Development Consent Order (DCO) to construct and operate the Scheme. The application will be made to the Planning Inspectorate. If the application is accepted by the Planning Inspectorate, a panel will examine the application and make a recommendation to the Secretary of State for Transport, who will ultimately decide whether the application is granted consent and whether we are able to use compulsory acquisition powers. We intend to make our application in mid-2021.

Highways England carried out its formal pre-application consultation in 2018. Since then, our proposals have been amended to reflect the feedback we received from that consultation, and further work that has been undertaken to progress the design. We have undertaken a review of the design and some further survey works. This has led to some key changes to the scheme design presented at the 2018 consultation, and we are now proposing an alternative northern route at the eastern end of the scheme which addresses the public and stakeholder feedback and a number of other changes throughout the scheme.

We have enclosed a project update brochure (Autumn 2020). The brochure sets out how the scheme has developed since the 2018 statutory consultation.







In view of the refinements we have made to the scheme design, we now believe that you have:

- a Category 1 interest in land or property in the area of the Scheme under section 44 of the Planning Act 2008. This means that we believe you are an owner, lessee, tenant or occupier of land or property affected by the scheme; and/or
- a Category 2 interest in land or property in the area of the Scheme under section 44 of the Planning Act 2008. This means that we believe you have an interest in the land; or have power to sell and convey the land, or to release the land.

To enable construction and ongoing operation of the scheme, we may need to take permanent ownership or temporary possession of your land or impact on existing rights you hold over land. We could also need to seek legal powers to compulsorily acquire new rights over your land.

We are therefore writing to you to ensure that you have the opportunity to provide feedback on our proposals before we submit them. Before we submit our application for a DCO, we will take account of any comments you submit, as well as undertake engagement with relevant stakeholders about the refined scheme layout and proposals. We are consulting with you on the proposed scheme from **Monday 19th October 2020 to Thursday 19th November 2020.**

This formal consultation is an important opportunity for you to share your views. It will enable us to take your views into account in developing and refining our proposals in advance of submitting our application to the Planning Inspectorate. There will be limited opportunity to amend the proposals once the application has been submitted to the Planning Inspectorate, so now is the best time to have your say on the scheme.

We would like to use this consultation to understand the potential impacts that the scheme may have on your land or interest. We would also like to work with you to reduce any impact as far as possible, and we can do that more effectively if we fully understand how you use the land and how our scheme may affect that use. You may also wish to consider whether your interests in any surrounding land not acquired by the scheme may be affected. Please use the contact details below to give us your comments.

Please note that while you will be entitled to compensation if your land or interests are acquired, or if temporary possession is taken, this is not a matter which will be taken into account when considering the application for the DCO. Compensation disputes will be determined by the Lands Chamber of the Upper Tribunal and not by the Planning Inspectorate.

I am writing to you regarding Highways England's proposed A47 Wansford to Sutton Scheme (the Scheme) which will improve journeys along the A47 to the west of Peterborough

The Scheme consists of upgrading the existing 1.6 mile section of single carriageway between Wansford and Sutton by providing a new dual carriageway to dual carriageway and junction improvements. The existing A47 from Wansford to Sutton experiences delays and high levels of congestion during peak hours. Highways England aim to improve the traffic flow, reducing journey times on the route, increasing the route safety and resilience. The Scheme is also intended to support economic growth by making journeys safer and more reliable.

The Scheme is a Nationally Significant Infrastructure Project (NSIP) under the Planning Act 2008 (as amended) (the 2008 Act). This means we will apply for a Development Consent Order (DCO) to construct and operate the Scheme. This application will be made to the Planning Inspectorate (the Inspectorate), who will examine the application on behalf of the Secretary of State. We intend to make our application for a DCO in mid-2021.

Highways England carried out its formal pre-application consultation in 2018. Since then our proposals have been amended to reflect the feedback we received from that consultation and further work that has been undertaken to progress the design. This has led to some key changes to the scheme design and we are now proposing an alternative northern route and several other changes which address the public and stakeholder feedback.

We have included with this letter a Project Update Brochure (Autumn 2020). The brochure sets out the refined Scheme layout and proposals and shows how the scheme has developed since the 2018 formal consultation. These do not significantly alter our preliminary environmental impact assessment as set out in the Preliminary Environmental Information Report (PEIR) in 2018.

This update also gives you an opportunity to give us your views on the updated and refined Scheme, before the DCO application is submitted. Currently we intend to submit the application in mid- 2021. We will take







account of comments you submit; whilst also undertaking further engagement with relevant stakeholders about the revised Scheme.

Investing in the A47

The A47 is an important connection linking the cities of Norwich and Peterborough, the towns of Wisbech, Kings Lynn, Dereham, Great Yarmouth and Lowestoft and a succession of villages in what is largely a rural area.

As part of a multi-billion investment to improve journeys on England's major A-roads and motorways, the Government is funding a package of six projects on the 115-mile stretch of the A47 between Peterborough and Great Yarmouth. Together, the proposals will relieve congestion and improve the reliability of journey times for drivers.

The projects include converting almost eight miles of single carriageway to dual carriageway and improving key junctions along the A47 road.

The other A47 road improvement projects are:

- A47 Thickthorn junction
- A47/A141 Guyhirn junction
- A47 North Tuddenham to Easton dualling
- A47 Blofield to North Burlingham dualling
- A47 Great Yarmouth junction





Why are the Wansford to Sutton improvements needed?

The Wansford to Sutton section of the A47 is approximately 1.6 miles long, located to the west of Peterborough between the existing junction with the A1 and the Nene Way roundabout near Sutton.

Whilst around half of the A47 is already built to dual carriageway standard, the Wansford to Sutton section is not. This section of the A47 acts as a bottleneck, and this causes congestion, resulting in longer and unreliable journey times. In addition, this section of the A47 has a poor safety record.

Our proposed changes will help to relieve congestion, reduce journey times, support economic growth and make the road better for motorists.

Project benefits

By delivering these improvements to the junction, we aim to:

- improve road safety for all road users, ensuring the road design meets modern standards for a major A-road
- shorten journey times, make journey times more reliable, and provide capacity for a rise in future traffic
- contribute to sustainable economic growth
- help the road to better cope with incidents such as collisions, breakdowns, road maintenance and extreme weather
- ensure the proposals consider the local communities
- provide a safer route between communities for walking, cycling and horse riding





How you've been involved

In early 2017, we held a public consultation on three potential route options to gain your feedback and to help shape our plan to improve the Wansford to Sutton stretch of the A47 at an early stage. These were:

Option 1	Dualling the existing A47
Option 2	Building a new dual carriageway partly to the north and partly to the south of existing A47
Option 3	Building a new dual carriageway to the north of the existing A47

Over 170 people attended the four days of public events and we received 170 responses to the consultation. Around 86% supported the need to improve this section of the A47 and agreed that our proposals would be beneficial in reducing congestion and improving journey times.

Having reviewed the feedback following the consultation, and following further assessments, Option 2 was announced as the preferred route in August 2017.

We then developed our design further to reduce the impact on the River Nene and its flood plain.

A Statutory Consultation was held between September and November 2018 where the public and other consultees were asked for their views on the project proposals. What's happened since the statutory consultation?

Since the consultation in 2018, we have analysed all the responses and engaged with key stakeholders to fully understand the feedback received. As a result, we are now proposing changes to the design, including an alternative northern route at the eastern end between Sutton Heath Road and the A47/Nene junction.

We have compared our latest proposed design against the 2018 design and have considered environmental and economic factors, as well as the complexity of the scheme construction, and traffic levels. A number of responses to the Statutory Consultation suggested that a road to the north of the existing A47 would be preferred. As a result of that feedback, we have considered that

However, a road entirely north of the existing A47 is not feasible due to the location of the Scheduled Monument at Sacrewell Farm. Scheduled Monuments are nationally important archaeological sites or historic buildings and are given protection by Historic England from unauthorised changes to legally protect them from damage and destruction. We are also aware of a Neolithic barrow and a Roman farmstead that could be in the area.

Therefore, a route north of the existing A47 at the eastern end of the scheme between Sutton Heath Road and the A47/Nene junction has been developed. This means that the new A47 would avoid Ancient Woodland and would also have less ecological impact.



Our proposed design

Our proposal is for a new stretch of dual carriageway which largely follows the existing A47 at the Wansford end, crossing to the north and running parallel to the existing A47 after the Scheduled Monument.

There will also be a dedicated slip road from the A1 southbound to the A47 eastbound to alleviate congestion at the junction.

The existing single carriageway for westbound traffic across the A1 bridge at Wansford will be kept the same.

There will be a new southern arm coming from the eastern Wansford roundabout for the filling station and access to Sacrewell Farm.

The Nene roundabout will be relocated further to the west, close to the current Sutton Heath Road junction.

The village of Upton will now access the A47 via Sutton Heath Road, joining at the new roundabout.

The existing A47 will be kept for local access to Sutton village.

The revised proposals that we intend to submit for planning approval include alterations to the roundabouts at Wansford.

- Improvements at the Western Wansford roundabout:
 - improved entry from the A1 northbound slip road
 - improved exit to the A47 eastbound
 - new left turn lane between A1 northbound slip road and the A47 eastbound, rather than a merged lane
 - new cycle crossing on the A47 west of the Wansford roundabouts,
 removing cycles from the A1 bridge


- Improvements at the Eastern Wansford roundabout:
 - enlarged roundabout
 - new lane to the south of the roundabout, providing access to the filling station and to Sacrewell Farm under the new A47

The latest proposed design also includes the following changes to the existing A47 and surrounding roads:

- removal of the bus stop and the direct road access to the A1 from the properties adjacent to Windgate Way due to the close proximity to the proposed southbound A1-A47 slip road
- the Sutton Drift will be closed to vehicles
- a new walking and cycling route will pass under the A47 at the existing Sutton Heath junction
- a straight link road will be formed from the relocated A47 Sutton roundabout, linking into the existing Sutton Heath Road at its junction with Langley Bush Road
- a new junction will be created to allow access to Heath House.
- Upton Road will no longer be directly accessed from the A47
- new passing places will be discussed with the local authority

Additional design refinements may be made ahead of our planning application as a result of further engagement with key stakeholders, for example closing the Peterborough Road access onto the A1 northbound is being considered.




