Dear A47 Wansford to Sutton case team,

I note from the National Infrastructure Planning website that the next step for the A47 Wansford to Sutton project is for the Rule 6 letter (including date of Preliminary Meeting and a draft Examination Timetable) to be sent.

We are also aware that any Preliminary Meeting date and Written Submissions deadline are likely to fall in December and / or January. Historic England has very limited resource, and we try to plan ahead for resource-intensive work (such as NSIP examinations, especially the Written Representations deadline) as much as possible.

This is particularly important in the period around Christmas and New Year as (in addition to bank holidays and weekends) our staff are expected to take off the three other weekdays 'in between'; in other words, we will not be at work between 25<sup>th</sup> December 2021 and 3<sup>rd</sup> January 2022, inclusive. In addition, some staff have already booked additional leave in December and/or January.

We would therefore be very grateful for any indication you might be able to give us regarding the expected dates of the Preliminary Meeting and Written Submission deadline, even if this has to be as broad as 'both expected in December', 'both expected in January' or 'Preliminary Meeting expected in December and the Written Submission deadline expected in January'.
