





 informed by traffic modelling. This could include improvements within the existing highway boundary
 to some existing junctions within the red line boundary, in addition to amended parking
 arrangements;
- Additional signage to assist the movement of traffic in response to network conditions and the openings / dosings of the double leaf bascule bridge;
- The relocation of existing allotments to compensate for an area to be lost as a result of the proposed scheme;
- New public realm, landscape, ecology and sustainable drainage improvements;
- Provision of small vessel weiting facilities to the north and south of the crossing, either as floating portions or additional fendering to the existing berths, including any dredging and quay strengthening works that may be required;
- Provision of a large vessel waiting facility, if deemed necessary following risk assessment, at a remote location south of the crossing, including any dredging, quay strengthening, fendering and mooring alterations required;
- Provision of drainage infrastructure, lighting and landscaping.

The Third River Crossing will be EIA development for the purposes of the Infrastructure Planning (Environmental Impact Assessment) Regulations. It will therefore require environmental impact assessment and an Environmental Statement will accompany the application for a DCO.

The Applicant is seeking views on the current detailed proposals for the Third River Crossing (e.g. alignment, junctions, design details and mitigation measures), Views are also sought on all other matters relating to the Third River Crossing, including the principle of and need for a new crossing, and the effects on the environment.
