Great Yarmouth Third River Crossing Formal Consultation under Section 42 of the Planning Act 2008

I am writing to formally consult you under Section 42 of the Planning Act 2008 on Norfolk County Council's proposals for the Great Yarmouth Third River Crossing.

Why are we consulting?

Norfolk County Council intends to build a new bridge across the River Yare to link the A47 at the Harfrey's Roundabout in the Southtown area of Great Yarmouth to the South Denes area and the enterprise zone on the other side of the river ("the Proposed Scheme").

On 26 February 2018, the Secretary of State for Transport determined that the Proposed Scheme is nationally significant and requires development consent under the Planning Act 2008. As a result, Norfolk County Council intends to make an application for a Development Consent Order (DCO) to progress the Proposed Scheme. If a DCO is made by the Secretary of State, it is anticipated that construction would commence in late 2020. Further information relating to the Proposed Scheme, including the Preliminary Environmental Information Report ('PEIR') that has been compiled for it, is set out below and provided on the memory stick that is enclosed with this letter.

Section 42 Duty to Consult

As part of the process of seeking a DCO, Norfolk County Council is required to carry out pre-application consultation in accordance with Section 42 of the Planning Act 2008. This requires consultation with specified local authorities and prescribed consultees. You are being consulted because Section 42 also requires consultation with those with specified interests in land to which the Proposed Scheme relates, including people who would or might be able to make a "relevant claim"¹ if the DCO were to be made and fully implemented.

¹ This means a claim under section 10 of the Compulsory Purchase Act 1965 (compensation for the taking, or injurious affection, of land subject to compulsory purchase); a claim under Part 1 of the Land Compensation Act 1973 (compensation for depreciation of land value by physical factors caused by use of public works); or (c) a claim under section 152(3) of the Planning Act 2008 (compensation for injurious affection of land by the carrying out of works which would be authorised by the DCO if made)

However, please note that the process of seeking a DCO is at an early stage and the final form and extent of the Proposed Scheme have yet to be resolved. The purpose of this letter and the consultation is therefore to seek your views on the merits of the current Proposed Scheme and its effects.

At present the County Council does not intend to carry out any further rounds of pre-application consultation, and if so **this consultation will be the last opportunity to comment on proposals for the Third River Crossing prior to the application for a DCO being made.**

However, should the application for a DCO be accepted there will be the opportunity for people to register with the Planning Inspectorate (which is the organisation that administers applications for DCOs) and provide a written summary of their views on the application. This will enable them to become an Interested Party and be able to participate in the subsequent statutory examination through which the submitted application for a DCO will be assessed prior to its determination by the relevant Secretary of State.

You should also bear in mind that the Planning Act 2008 regime is intended to provide, so far as practicable, a single forum for assessment and authorisation of a proposed project. A DCO, if granted, removes the need for planning permission, can authorise the compulsory acquisition of land and rights in land, and deal with many other regulatory consents which a project would otherwise need. This emphasises the importance of the present pre-application consultation and its role in shaping the Proposed Scheme.

How to take part in this consultation

Enclosed with this letter is a memory stick containing the following documents:

- (1) **A Consultation Brochure** – This provides an overall summary of the scheme.
- (2) **A Preliminary Environmental Information Report (PEIR)** - For the purposes of this formal pre-application consultation, Preliminary Environmental Information in the form of a Report (PEIR) has been prepared in accordance with Regulation 12 of the Infrastructure Planning (Environmental Impact Assessment) Regulations 2017. The PEIR details the current proposals for the Proposed Scheme and explains the methods and preliminary findings of our assessment of the environmental impacts of the proposals. Its purpose is to enable consultees to develop an informed view of the likely significant effects of the Proposed Scheme. Those views will assist the Council in preparing the statutory Environmental Statement which will accompany the application for a DCO.
- (3) **A Non-Technical Summary of the PEIR** – This has been prepared and forms part of the consultation documents for this consultation.
- (4) **A Non-Technical Note on Transport Modelling** – This has been provided in order to describe the process that has been undertaken to produce the provisional daily traffic flow information contained within the Consultation Brochure.
- (5) **Design Process Summary** – This provides a summary of the how the design of the Proposed Scheme has been developed.
- (6) **Scheme Photo Visualisations** – These show illustrative examples of a bascule bridge with counter weights below bridge deck and knuckles built out into river and a bascule bridge with counter weights above bridge deck and piers in the river, which form the envelope of bridge options described by the PEIR.

- (7) **Questions and Answers** – A list of frequently asked questions about the project and their answers.

How to respond to the consultation

Norfolk County Council is already undertaking a separate general consultation with the local community in accordance with Section 47 of the Planning Act 2008. You may have already received information regarding this consultation, which is taking place between 20 August 2018 and 5 October 2018. The Council has also published notices in the press which invite comments by 5 October.

However, as you have also been identified as having an interest in land in the vicinity of the Proposed Scheme (which entitles you to individual consultation under Section 42 of the Act) and because the enclosed memory stick contains a number of documents that you may want to consider, **the deadline for receipt of your response to the Section 42 consultation described in this letter has been extended to 23:59hrs on Sunday 21 October 2018.**

Personal details will not be disclosed to any third parties except where the County Council is required to do so by law (e.g. where required to respond to a formal Freedom of Information Act request)

Next Steps

The Council expects to submit the DCO application for examination by the Secretary of State, via the Planning Inspectorate in Spring 2019.

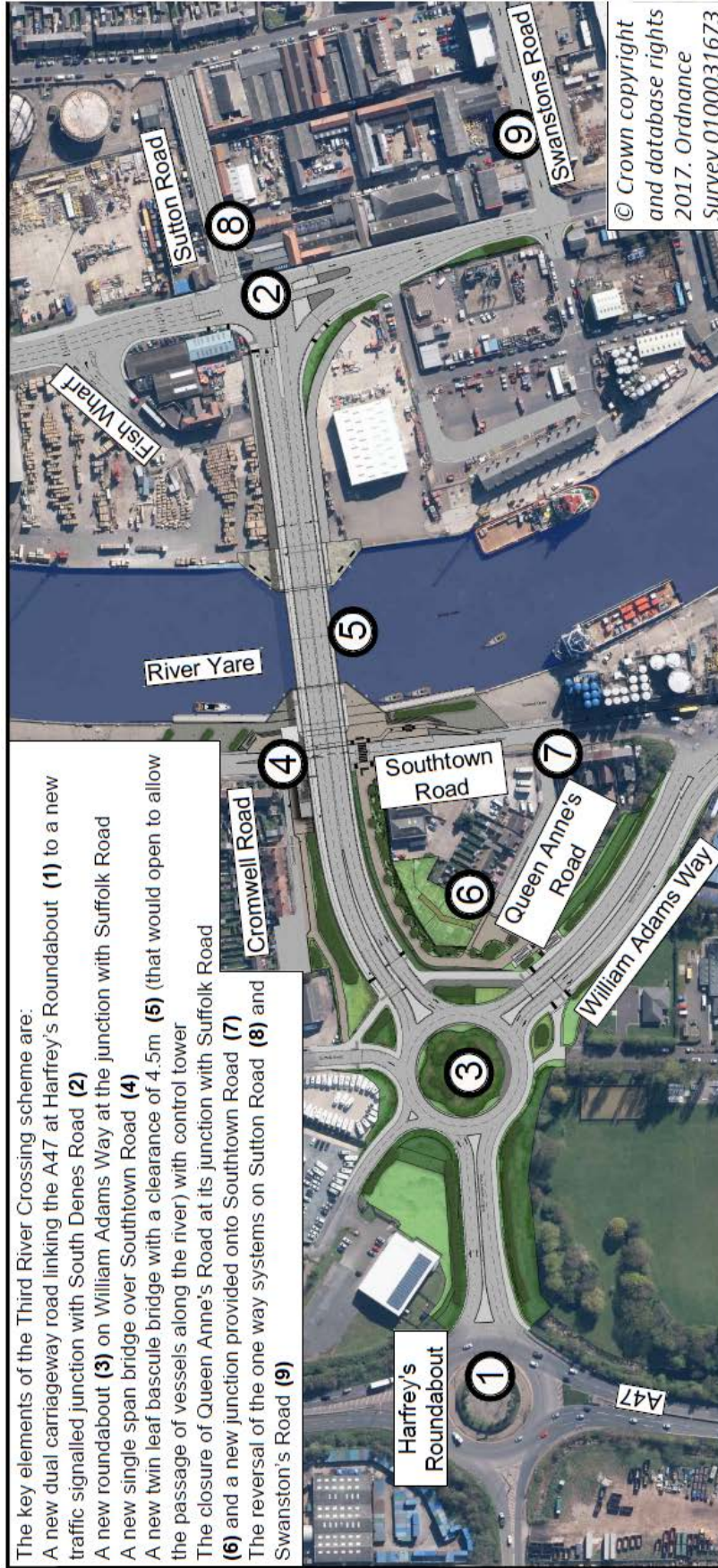
